The 11+ exam is a selective test organised by county or independent grammar schools to select 10-year-old children to state funded secondary schools based on academic performance. Parinith qualified 11-plus exams at Ripon Grammar in Yorkshire, Bexley County, Redbridge, Buckinghamshire County, Essex County, Warwickshire County, The Triffin School, Wiltshire County but chose the Gloucestershire school after scoring in the top ten per cent of students taking their test.

Queensgate Out & About

On Tuesday morning, our **Year 2** Out and About group visited the Dragon Tree in Brighstone. The children re-capped their recent Science learning about what living things need to survive. They then designed their own dragons using clay, talking about what their dragons would need to survive, what they would eat and what kind of habitat they would live in. The children all enjoyed listening to the story Zog and the Flying Doctors by Julia Donaldson. They then had fun playing Pooh sticks and paddling in the stream.

"We went to the Dragon Tree. A long time ago, there used to be a dragon, and the people didn't want a dragon, so they killed it, and it turned into a tree! We sat on the tail and made our own clay dragons!" Marnie-Rae 2KA

The Out and About team from **Year 5** went for a walk along the Sandown cycle path to Alverstone Nature Reserve. The group were challenged to work out the six figure grid reference of their location and follow a trail on their maps, using compasses to describe their direction of travel. The children loved seeing a Heron, Blue tits, Great tits, Robins, a Pheasant and a Red squirrel on their walk.



Queensgate Out & About Continued

Last half term the children in **Year 1** were learning about their senses and the seasons. On Wednesday morning, the Out and About group visited Borthwood Copse. The children used their senses on a walk through the woodland, selecting Autumn leaves, sticks, moss, lichen and acorns. They worked in pairs to create a collage using the natural objects they had found. The children listened to the story *The Leaf Thief* by Alice Hemming, whilst having their snack and had fun building dens, balancing on logs and exploring the woods.



The **6TM** Out and About group went orienteering in Firestone Copse, on Wednesday afternoon. The children were amazing at locating the markers around the forest and recording the letters they found on their control cards. Working together, the group managed to find 13 markers!

PE news

It has been a busy first half term with breakdancing/beatboxing sessions across the school, the start of the football season, tag rugby fixtures played across KS2 and even a wheelchair basketballer visiting some classes. During PE lessons, all classes have been thinking about fundamental movement skills – working on improving their agility, balance and co-ordination. These skills have then been developed into game play in the older year groups.

Inclusive sport

We started the year using the Paralympics as our focus. The children enjoyed participating and watching a range of inclusive sports. This was developed further with a visit from East Cowes Local, Gary Butler, who spent the afternoon discussing wheelchair basketball with the children in year 6 and showing them some skills. The children then enjoyed using the wheelchairs borrowed from St Georges to try out some skills. We have also been successful in applying for some inclusive sports equipment from BBC Super Movers which has just arrived so we will be able to continue to provide more opportunities for all our children to try new activities.



Uniform reminder

On PE days children are expected to wear their PE uniform: a light blue t-shirt, navy shorts, navy tracksuit bottoms or leggings. They should still be wearing their Queensgate sweatshirt for class lessons. If children wish to bring another navy sweatshirt to wear to their PE lesson, this is recommended. For health and safety reasons, hooded tops can't be worn for PE lessons and therefore shouldn't be worn in class. Children must also remove jewellery including earrings for lessons. If earrings can't be removed, children must bring tape in to cover the earrings.

Monster Kickabout

We start this term taking part in the Monster Kickabout 2024. This is a national project aimed at getting all children to enjoy football. To help us promote football, we have received some game resources/ideas, bibs and footballs. Over the next two weeks our Year 6 football teams (boys and girls) will organise a special football event for each key stage at lunchtime.

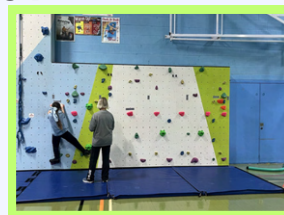
Tag Rugby

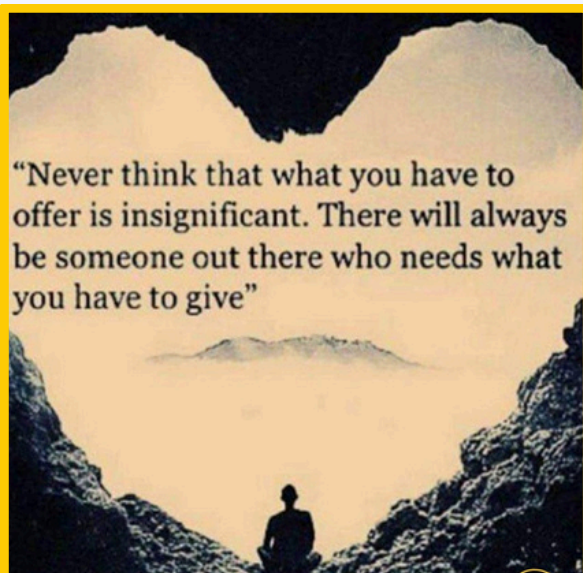

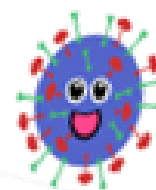

A core aim of the show is to help children discover simple actions to improve their mental health.

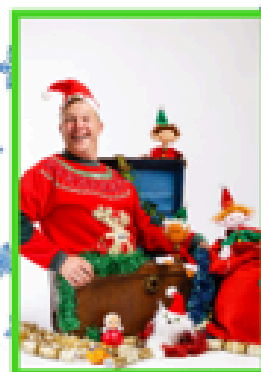
