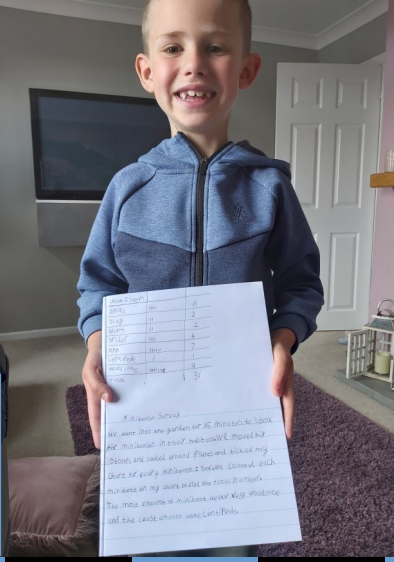
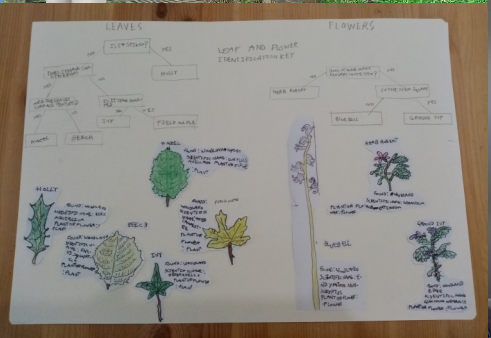
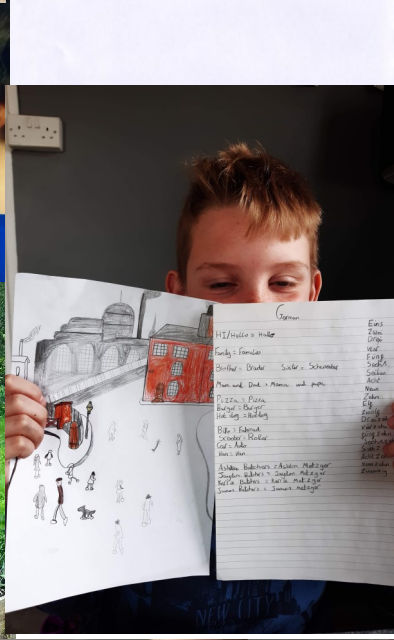

Waffle has big blue goggles. He has a shiny orange suit. His flippers are sharp like shark fins.

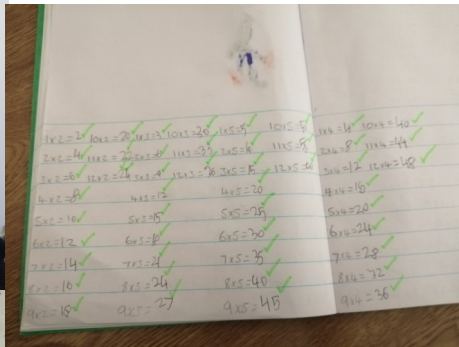

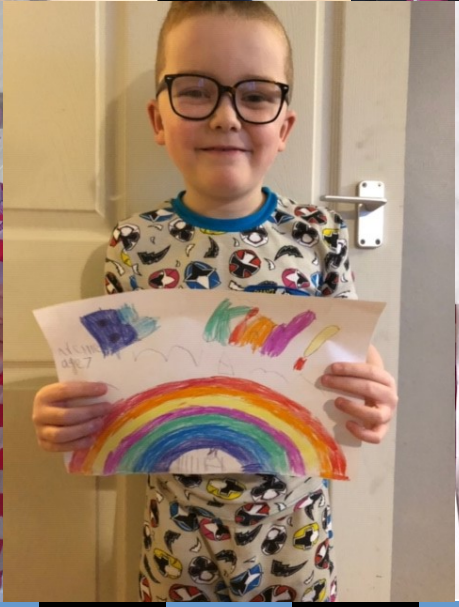
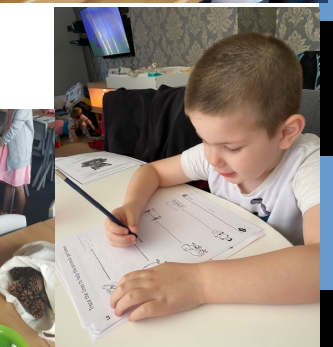
