#### **Covid Update**

There is new guidance out from the Department of Education (DfE). It looks very different to this time last year. Here is a summary of the situation.

- There are no-longer bubbles
- Assemblies have resumed, although we have split them into key stages so we can spread out
- Individuals are not required to self-isolate even if they are in the same household as someone with Covid
- No face coverings are necessary
- No social distancing

- Please do not send rucksacks into school (apart from Year 6) as we have no-where to store them




## Then try this....

#### Benji Blog


Benji had a lovely summer and enjoyed his trip to Scotland!
