We welcome Mrs Blanchflower to the teaching team in 2KA whilst Mrs Arnell is off work.



Hello, my name is Mrs Blanchflower and I am covering Mrs Arnell in 2KA. I am looking forward to getting to know the children, staff, parents and Queensgate community during my time here.

Out of school my interests include listening to music, gardening and walking my dogs. I also enjoy going to quizzes when I can too!

We have also had 14 applications for the new 1:1 teaching assistant position; we will be interviewing next week and will let you know the outcome in due course.

Out and About

On Tuesday morning a small group of children from **1KS** were selected to choose the school Christmas tree. The children visited Radcliffe's Farm Shop in Blackwater. They carefully helped Mrs Jacobs, Mr Cox and I select the perfect tree, they enjoyed paying and helping to wrap it in netting. After we returned, all of 1KS had the opportunity to explore a variety of toys from the past as part of their topic on *Toys and Games*. Many of the toys were about 90 years old, belonging to my grandparents when they were little. The children looked at what the toys were made from, how toys have changed over the years and then sorted the toys into chronological order. They then had fun playing with the metal cars, 'wobble toys' and bagatelle.



3PT have been learning about the Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age. The children have been finding out about how people lived during pre-history. There is new archaeological evidence which shows that people may have eaten bread (more like a pitta) as long ago as Neolithic times when they began farming and possibly began grinding grain. On Tuesday afternoon, the children enjoyed making a fire on the Patch and cooked pitta breads over the fire to eat.



RAS are continuing their topic on *People Who Help Us*. On Wednesday morning they welcomed dentist, Jo Thompson, into their class. Jo spoke to them about the importance of brushing your teeth twice a day, for two minutes each time. The children took part in a two minute teeth brushing dance, made play-dough teeth and learnt how to give the fillings, used toothbrushes and paste to clean 'teeth' and designed some super monsters with funny teeth! Jo was very impressed with how keen to learn and engaged in all the activities RAS were. Well done children!



2KA have been learning about the weather this week. On Wednesday afternoon they made their own 'weather wheels' as well as practising counting with money. The children had a great time on the Patch, creating their own woodland shop. They used coin number-lines to help them to work out how much change they should receive. The children were very confident at showing me the methods they'd been taught in Maths.
