Well done everyone, thank you for being a credit to our school. Here's the write up of the day;



On **Friday 28<sup>th</sup> June**, a group of children from **Year 3** spent the day over at West Wight Sports centre for the PEACH games. This is an island event which gives children the opportunity to participate in a range of activities and sports; these included, archery, new age kurling, boccia, cricket, orienteering, golf, football, NFL and athletics. As well as a 'sports village' with games and health & community information. Throughout the day, the children moved around the different zones, although this was a long day with a lot to experience, the children approached everything with drive and enthusiasm. Behaviour was impeccable and everyone had a fantastic day!

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## Out & About

The children in **Reception** are learning about the *seaside* this half term. This week our Out and About group visited the Bembridge RNLI lifeboat station. They learnt about seaside safety and what to do in case of an emergency at the beach or in the sea. The children were all fantastic at listening and responding when volunteer, Deborah, spoke to the children about the role of the lifeboat crew.

“We went to see a lifeboat. It was red, yellow, white and the top bit was orange. The lifeboat people save people from the sea. They wear yellow jackets and yellow boots and helmets. The lady told us don’t go in the sea if you see a red flag!” Luca RSD



On Tuesday afternoon our **Year 5** Out and About group visited the Wight Aviation Museum to learn more about the history of the Black Arrow Satellite launcher and rocket travel. The children learnt about survival in Space and what equipment is needed in manned rockets. They also found out about the technology behind rockets, how they work and how parts of a rocket jettison whilst travelling into Space. The group all enjoyed exploring launching rockets, experimenting how they could make them go higher.

“We went to a Sandown Airport and we looked at some models of rockets. There is a full size model of the Black Arrow rocket. Some people call it the ‘lipstick rocket’ because it looks like a giant lipstick. It is important to the Isle of Wight because it was designed on the Island, built in East Cowes and tested at the Needles, then properly launched in Australia.

We then we went outside and launched foam rockets and water bottle rockets, we used compressed air and water to launch them. I really like using the water rockets.” Arthur 5TS



Our **Year 4** children are carrying out a local historical study about Queen Victoria. This week's Out and About team walked from school to Osborne House and enjoyed exploring the gardens, beach and grounds of the estate, learning about Queen Victoria's Island home. They clocked up over 12,000 steps by midday! The group were in awe of the beautiful walled garden and the planting on the terraces. They were really fascinated by all the artefacts in the museum by Swiss Cottage, that had been sent from around the world as gifts to the Royal children or brought back from their travels.

"We walked to Osborne House because we are learning about Victorians. We found out about Queen Victoria's children and what they liked to do. They liked playing in Swiss Cottage and growing their own plants." Oscar H 4MC

"In Out and About we went to Osborne House. It was a long walk but I enjoyed it. We walked through the walled gardens and saw tropical plants in the green houses. We went to the museum and saw a five legged deer and the worlds smallest scissors and pen knife." Adhvik 4MC

"We went for a very long walk - we saw loads of cool things like fruit in the gardens and stuffed animals in the museum. We saw lots of trees that Prince Albert planted." Jacob 4MC
