Out & About

On Tuesday morning the 2EC Out and About group went to St Helens Duver to play some team games. The children were split into groups and challenged to 'cross the river', working collaboratively to use equipment to get all members of the team across, without falling in the 'water' (touching the grass). They then played other games including Big Foot, moving planks of wood in unison. This was a big challenge and the children had a good laugh trying not to fall over. It was brilliant to hear the children discussing ideas with each other and trying to resolve any disagreements together. Mr Giles surprised us and joined our Out and About session, bringing biscuits to share with the children. It was super to see him and hear about his new, retired life!



The Year 3 children will be learning about rocks and soils soon in Science. In readiness, this week's Out and About team walked from Culver Down to Whitecliff Bay to look at the cliff formation. We talked about the three types of rocks; igneous, sedimentary and metamorphic. The children identified that the Isle of Wight is made up of different types of sedimentary rock including chalk, clays, limestones and tertiary sands and that fossils can be found in sedimentary rocks too. Due to it being so permeable we are prone to landslips and erosion which were very visible in the bay. The children were great at walking and enjoyed taking it in turns to lead the group.



Our final Year 4 Out and About group visited Briddlesford Farm on Wednesday morning. The children started their tour by meeting the calves and learning about the produce in the farm shop. We talked about food miles, dairy production and the meat industry. They loved meeting some very young calves, seeing the pregnant cows enjoying the fields, helping to feed the heifers as well as the bulls and dairy cows. As they toured the farm they learnt about the cows digestion, teeth and the milking process. The children were all brilliantly behaved and loved having the opportunity to be hands on with the animals.



The children in Year 1 have begun learning about the five senses. During Out and About on Wednesday afternoon the children explored Borthwood Copse. They used lots of amazing adjectives to describe what they could hear, see, feel and smell. We also talked about the signs of Autumn and the children were tasked with creating an autumn face using leaves, acorns and natural found materials. We shared some autumnal stories and then had fun playing in the woods!



The Out and About after school club went to Firestone Copse. They were treated to a hot chocolate in the woods and enjoyed bug hunting, balancing along fallen logs and finding signs of autumn together.

Attendance

It is hugely important that the children come to school everyday as the lessons build on from each other. If your child is not well please telephone the school office and let them know the reason for the absence, this should be followed up with an email or note to office@queensgateprimary.co.uk



If you would like leave of absence for an alternative reason to illness you must complete a leave of absence form (at least 14 days in advance of absence), these can be found in the school foyer.

Please remember to call the school when your child is absent (if we haven't heard from you by 9.15am we will contact you). It is important that you follow up this phone call with a written reason for the absence when your child returns to school.

Remember that good attendance will help your child to succeed at school.

Education and Inclusion Officer

We have continued, this year, to employ the services of the Education and inclusion Team at the local authority. The Education and Inclusion Officer (Mrs Tammy Vincent) comes into school on a regular basis and meets with our Attendance Officer (Mrs Cade) to analyse pupil absences. Mrs Vincent's role involves home visits, meeting with parents/carers, conducting parent interviews under the Police and Criminal Evidence Act and progressing specific cases to court. However, before any of this she is there to help and support you to get your child to school if you are having difficulty in doing so.

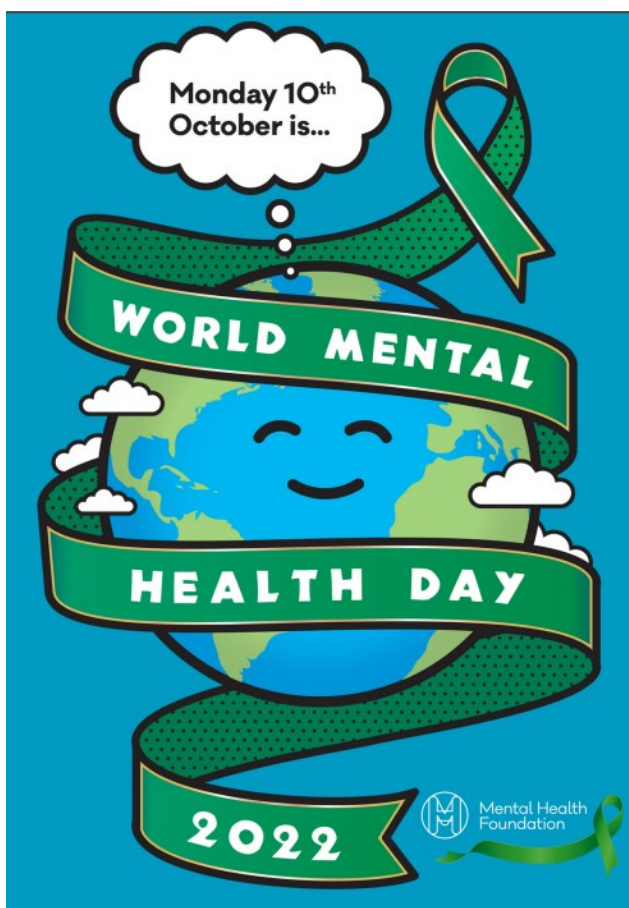

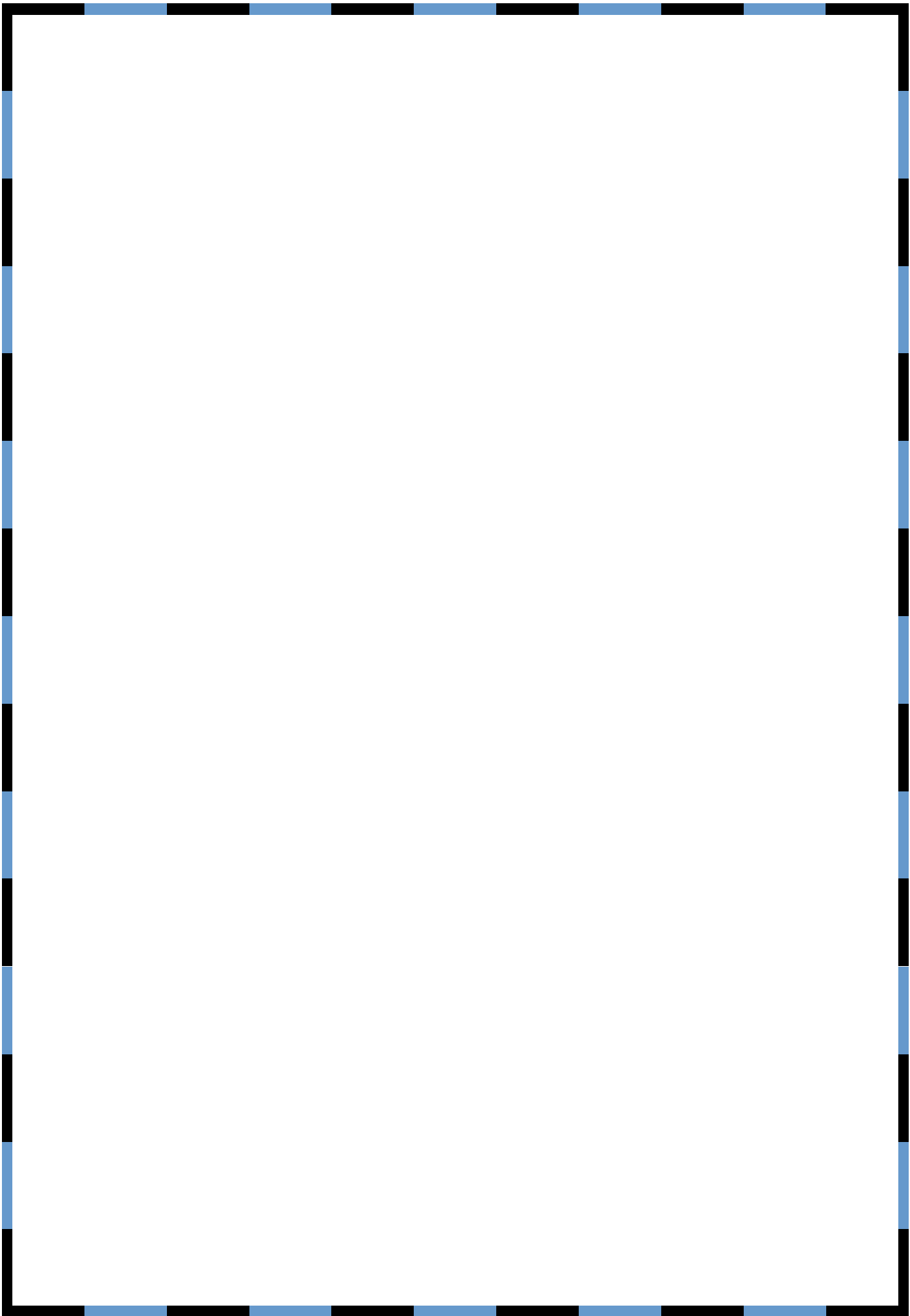

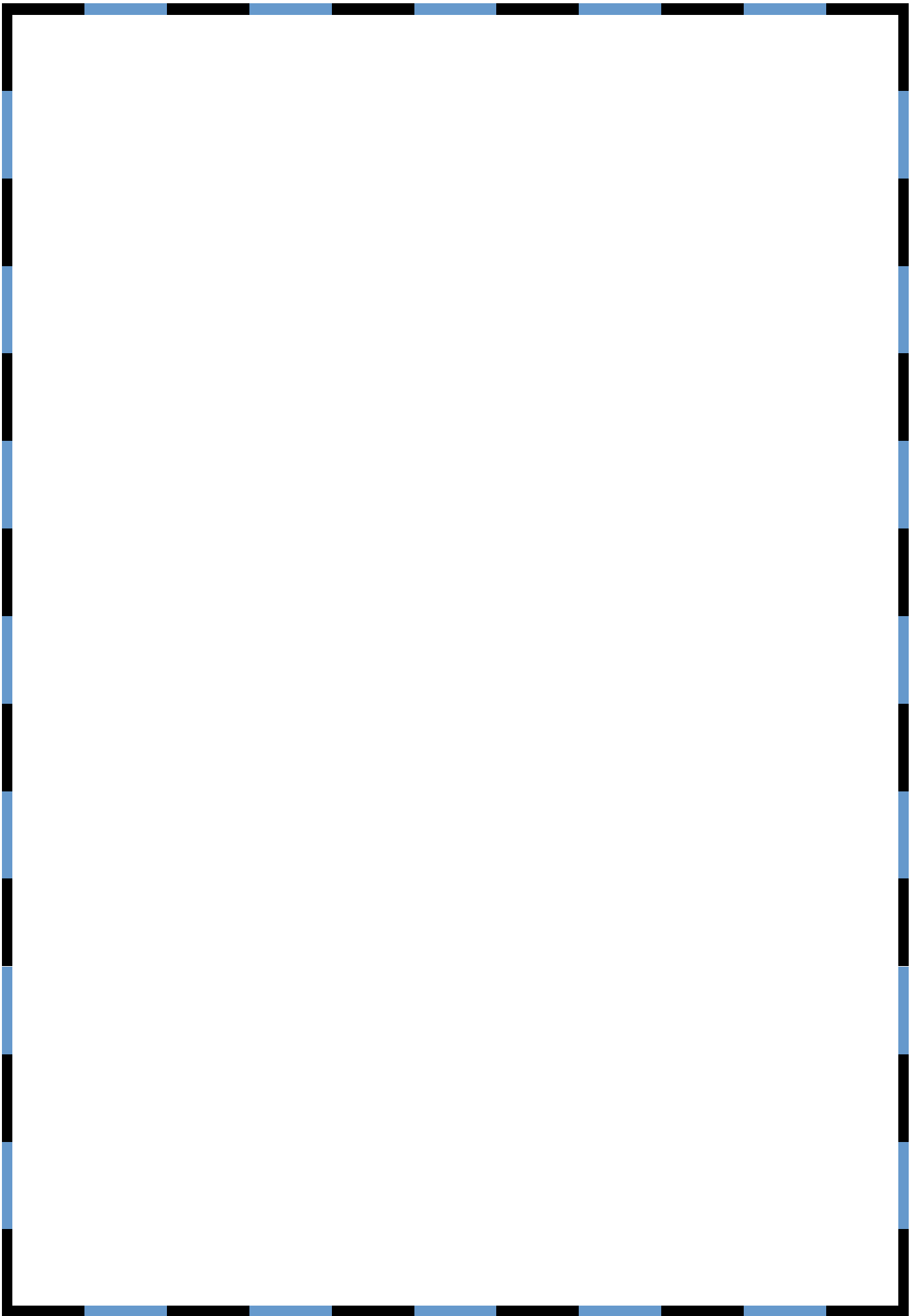
