Dear Parents/carers,

Happy New Year!

What a week it has been. A lot has happened since I wrote to you last Sunday. It turns out that our decision to close other than for Key Worker and vulnerable children was the right one with Boris Johnson announcing the same on Monday evening. Queensgate were lucky that we had an INSET day on Monday and the children did not all come into school for a day.

Please note we are still running Breakfast Club to enable Key workers to get to work on time. Please ring the school office if you would like a place.

Home Learning

We are trying to get the children's learning out to you in a variety of ways.

In Reception and Year 1, please make sure you are checking in with tapestry every day as daily challenges and activities are being up-loaded there.

To access Year 2 and Year 3 work, please go onto our school website and click the tab Children then your child's year group.

Years 4, 5 and 6 work is all on Google classroom. Your child has been taught how to log on.

We have also made up packs for families unable to access on line learning. These can be collected from the front porch.

We learnt many lessons in lockdown 1 and we know that the children came back to school with large gaps in their learning. It is really important that all children access their learning either in school, through technology or through the packs. It is also crucial that the children submit their work back to their teachers so that the teachers can see how they are getting on and set the next work appropriately. We expect everyone to engage in the learning.

The guidance from the Department for Education suggests three to five hours of learning a day depending on the age of the child. For me the most important thing is not the amount of time but the level of engagement and ensuring there is a two-way relationship between the children and their teachers. Please tell the children we expect them to try hard with their work just as they do at school.


It is really important for children to exercise and keep physically active - not only for physical benefits but for mental health benefits. Here is a link with suggested activities

Using an Amazon tablet?

I have been researching how to install the google classroom app onto an amazon fire tablet. I have discovered that because Amazon and Google are rival companies, the google classroom app is not in the amazon app store. It is possible to install the app, but you would have to bypass some of the system security settings and I would not recommend this.

What I would recommend instead, is that you use the 'Silk Browser' which is the amazon version of Google Chrome for accessing the web. This has a swirly circular icon which looks a bit like a marble.

I would suggest opening the Silk Browser app, then going to https://classroom.google.com

It should take you to the classroom page. You can see the work set but probably won't be able to fill in a form through it though.

Free School Meals

Voucher scheme:

Gavin Williamson said the following in his speech:

I know there is, understandably, concern about free school meals. We are going to provide extra funding to support schools to provide food parcels or meals to eligible children. Where schools cannot offer food parcels or use local solutions, we will ensure a national voucher scheme is in place so that every eligible child can access free school meals while their school remains closed. DfE guidance published yesterday echoes the exact same message.

<u>The LA view:</u>

They have confirmed that it is their assessment from current DfE communications that schools should be providing a hamper or lunches and not vouchers. Vouchers are only to be used if the school is completely closed and there is no alternative.
