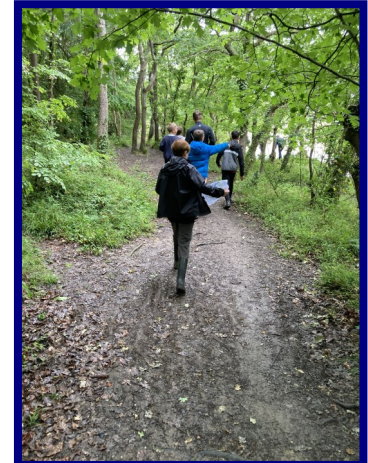


## Out & About

This half term the Reception classes are learning about the seaside. The RAB Out and About group went to Bembridge Lifeboat Station. The children learnt all about seaside safety and what the RNLI do to help look after people at sea. ## QUEENSGATE SPORT ROUNDUP

**Handball;** Year 5/6 handball team played against schools from across the Island. They came second in their first group of matches and went on to finish 6<sup>th</sup> out of 15 teams. All players gave 100% and showed good improvement throughout the competition.



**Cricket;** contrasting fortunes in the U-11 Cricket. The girls team played their IOW quarter final at Newchurch and lost despite some spirited batting and fielding. However, the open/boys team played at The Bay and racked up 303 for just 1 wicket. In reply, The Bay started brightly but some excellent bowling, fielding and catching restricted them to 263-6, so a 40 run win. They are now home to Newchurch or Carisbrooke in the semi-final.

Some Year 6 pupils took part in Sports Slam 2022 last month. Sports Slam is a new way of introducing sports to children from Sports Direct. The children completed a range of sporting challenges - some easier than others. For participating in the event, Queensgate have been given a selection of sports equipment so that other children can also have the opportunity to have a go at the challenges. Over the next few weeks, some Year 6 children will lead play sessions at lunchtimes teaching younger pupils the skills they have learnt.



### **Year 4 trip to Osborne House**

On Monday 6<sup>th</sup> June, Year 4 had a fantastic day drawing and exploring Osborne House and its grounds to kick start their 'Victorian Circus' topic. The children had a tour of the house, learning about how Queen Victoria and her family lived in East Cowes. They also chose aspects of the house and grounds to sketch - the statues proved popular subjects!

We'd love to know what you are reading at home. If you have any reading recommendations, please let us know so we can share them here.


## Mardi Gras

## **Privilege Seat Application Window – Academic Year 2022/2023**

This notice applies to those parents of current Year 6 students who are moving up to secondary school next year and wish to apply for a place on a Council-contracted school bus service.

Dear Parent/Guardian

The dates for the privilege seat application window for academic year 2022 have been finalised. Should you wish to apply for a privilege seat for your child to use the school bus service you will need to apply between **9am on Monday 27<sup>th</sup> June 2022 and 4pm on Friday 8<sup>th</sup> July 2022**. Please note that the online form will only be live between the above times and that applications received outside of this window will not be accepted.

Please also note the FAQs, Code of Good Practice and Ticket Terms and Conditions sections available via this webpage.

If you scroll to the bottom of the above webpage you will see the bus services for which you can apply. **This information will be live from 9am on Monday 27<sup>th</sup> June 2022**. Should the service you require not be listed you will not be able to apply for that service at this time.

Do bear in mind that making an application for a privilege seat does not guarantee a seat on the school bus.

Privilege seat ticket prices are set costs as follows.

Up to a full term £130.00

Up to half a term £65.00

Up to a full term AM or PM only £65.00

Up to half a term AM or PM only £32.50

### **Important Points to Note**

- There will only be 1 application window before the start of the academic year so please ensure you apply during this window for your child to be considered for a seat.
- Information on bus services that can be offered will be available on the website from **9am on Monday 27<sup>th</sup> June 2022**.
- We may not be able to provide an update on the number of seats available before the application window opens but please be aware seats availability will be very limited.
- There is a strict payment deadline for making payment. Should you miss this deadline, the seat offered to your child will be offered to the next child on the waiting list (should one exist) and your application will be cancelled.
- Once applications have been processed by the Transport Team you will be able to see the status of your application online as well as make payment without having to contact the Council.

Dear Parent/Carer

If you think your child is eligible for free Home to School Transport, please complete the relevant application form 'Application for Free Home to School Transport' or 'Application for Free Home to School Transport - Low income' in order to have transport in place for your child for the start of the new academic year 2022/23. Please complete your form by the deadline of **26<sup>th</sup> June 2022**. Should your application be received after this date, transport may not be in place for the start of the new year.
