Out & About

On Tuesday morning the **1KS** Out and About group went to Puckpool Park to help hunt for a lost bear! The children were amazing at reading the clues (using their phonic knowledge) and using their map reading skills to follow the trail. After finding the bear, they had a hot chocolate to celebrate (whilst listening to some stories about toys) and despite the rain, enjoyed playing in the park together.



The **3BM** Out and About team visited the Shipwreck Centre at Arreton Barns on Tuesday afternoon. The children took part in a variety of activities to extend their learning about the Stone Age. They had the opportunity to handle and log artefacts found off the coast of the Island. The children learnt about maritime archaeology and how a lobster helped divers to discover the Stone Age village, 11m below sea level at Bouldnor (near Yarmouth), unearthing 8,000 year old flint arrows, axes and tools.



The **4MC** Out and About children went to Yaverland Beach on Wednesday morning. After learning about the work of artists James Brunt and Andy Goldsworthy, the children were challenged to create their own sand sculptures with the theme of *Ancient Egypt*. They worked solo or in pairs to create 3D models in the sand of Sphinx, pyramids, hieroglyphics and the River Nile. It was rather chilly so they enjoyed a hot drink to warm up after completing their challenge.

On Wednesday afternoon half of **2KA** visited the Wight Aviation Museum at Sandown Airport. We were made very welcome by the incredibly knowledgeable and friendly team of volunteers including Michael Paler, the Mayor of East Cowes who joined us this week. The children had a great time learning about the history of flight, the life of Mary Ellis, the black rocket launch and the features of different aircraft. The children even had the opportunity to learn to fly! They each had a go at flying the Bulldog plane (an old propeller plane which has been turned into a simulator).




Then try this....
