

On Tuesday morning the fifth Out and About group visited the Green Barn Dairy Goat Farm, Yarmouth. The children enjoyed meeting the goats and drew some detailed drawings of the kids and milking goats. They asked Richard, the farmer, lots of great questions about the running of the farm. The children were welcomed into the café and enjoyed a glass (or three!) of goats milk. 'Richard milks 28 goats at the moment. They get milked by machines twice a day and usually produce 3 litres each. The milk has to be kept in a big fridge

straightaway before it's pasteurised' Riley G .

Year 6 Out and About children visited Parkhurst Forest on Tuesday afternoon. After navigating their way around a fallen tree the children used theirs maps and compasses to hunt for different orienteering posts. 'We saw different types of mushrooms in the forest including a red and white spotty toadstool called Fly Agaric. We couldn't touch it as it was poisonous. We saw a red squirrel too. It was fun and very muddy!' George 6TS



The final **Year 3** Out and About group got to visit the Shipwreck Centre and Maritime Museum on Wednesday morning. They learnt about the three

different periods within the Stone Age (Palaeolithic, Mesolithic and Neolithic). Jacqui, a Maritime



Archaeologist, spoke to the children about the submerged landscape at Bouldnor, Yarmouth, dating from Mesolithic times. The children were able to handle 8,000 year old archaeological finds from the Bouldnor site as well as learning about the dive equipment she has to wear.

'Divers must wear important kit; wetsuits or drysuits, fins, a mask, a tank of air, weights to help them sink and a jacket that makes them float.' Ethan 3BM

On Tuesday afternoon children from **Year 2** visited the Garlic Farm, Newchurch. They followed their maps and walked around the farm, enjoying the muddy puddles along the way! The children enjoyed seeing the ponies, highland Cowes and dragonflies by the lake. As we walked around the farm we talked about how different fruit and vegetables grow. The children discovered a metal structure in one of the fields and thought it could be an abandoned alien spaceship!


