The children looked at examples of Stone Age cave paintings that have been discovered around the world. Whilst on the patch they had a go at creating their own pictures inspired by cave paintings, using chalk and charcoal.





#### Support your child's reading

Here are some questions you can ask your child to support them with their reading. A successful reader needs to read at a good pace and with expression. Encourage your child to **re-read** to achieve fluency. Use **Echo reading**-Adult reads with **good expression** and child echoes the sentence back.

Retell the story... Adult: Can you tell me what happened in the story? Child: In the beginning... In the middle... At the end...

Setting Adult: What is the main setting of the story? What other settings are there? Can you find the words used to describe the setting?

#### Characters

Who is a good/bad character in the story? Can you tell me something the character **does** that tells you this? Can you tell me something the character **says** that tells you this? Child: A good/bad character is\_\_\_. I know they are good/bad because....

Problems Adult: What is the problem in the story? How is it solved? Are there any words you don't know the meaning of?

#### Language Can you find adjectives used in the story? Can you find verbs with \_\_\_\_\_\_ ed in the story? Can you find a sentence where the words are really descriptive?

#### Characters

Who is your favourite character in the story? Can you describe their personality? Child: My favourite character is \_\_\_\_\_. They are funny/ brave/ clever ( etc) when they\_\_\_\_\_.

#### Non-fiction

What features does the book have that make this non-fiction? How do they help you as a reader? Can you tell me an interesting fact you found out from reading this book?

#### **Positive Quote**

*"Strength doesn't come from what you can do. It comes from overcoming the things you once thought you couldn't."* 



Remember that good attendance will help your child to succeed at school.
