We talked about the Election Day on Thursday and the importance of voting. The children voted for their favourite trees. They spoke to



the group about why they'd chosen the tree and it's importance to them. The tree that got the most of our votes was representing The IOW NHS Trust Defibrillator Training and awareness, invaluable within our Queensgate community.



Harry, Isaac and Ryleigh demonstrated fantastic map reading skills on Tuesday afternoon, as they led the **Year 6** Out and About group around Firestone Copse. Queensgate Foundation Primary & Kynance & Independent Arts

Year 1 children were visited by Kerry from Independent Arts. She asked the children what helps people in their community. Hardly any of the children had been to or even heard of a residential care home before. We discussed about how some people when they get old find every day chores tricky. We played memory games, discussed photos and listened to stories.

Some pupils from Queensgate Foundation Primary school were chosen to take part in a 10 week art project with some of the elderly residents at Kynance. This has all been made possible by Independent Arts. Each week the 10 specially chosen Year 1 children participated in a variety of creative tasks that saw them work together with their residents partners. The children chosen showed they needed to develop their confidence, social, listen and in attention skills which they may not have fully done by the end of Reception class.

After the morning session, the children stayed to have lunch with the residents. They sat together and chatted about their families, homes and interests. Both the children and residents benefitted from this social interaction and they looked forward to seeing each other each week.


We have seen a great impact on the children's confidence and willingness to interact with more people. Their vocabulary has improved and they are now speaking much more clearly. The children have shown great resilience in trying new activities and encouraged the residents to take part. Most children have become more focused on tasks in school, have better perseverance and have gained confidence in their own abilities.
