Ash Randall - Free Style Footballer

On Monday, Ash Randall (World record breaking freestyle footballer) came into school to lead an assembly to both KS1 and KS2 children. Ash showed the children some tricks and then invited some staff and children to have a go. Throughout the assembly, Ash told the children about the importance of not giving up when something is hard and that it takes time and patience to learn new skills. During breaktimes this week, the children then had the chance to work on some of the skills Ash showed us. It has been great to see both girls and boys from all year groups having a go.

Mock interview by Jada 6TM

Today I am welcoming Ash Randall, a world record breaking freestyle footballer. He has travelled the world and visited some amazing places throughout his career. Ash is inspirational and learns new tricks and kicks all of the time. He is dedicated and not scared of hard work.

Jada: So Ash tell me, what's the achievement you're most proud of?

Ash: Good question. I have many achievements that I'm proud of. One of them was when I climbed up Tower 42, which has 932 stairs, whilst balancing a football on my back. I'm also very proud of when I juggled a football for 13.1 miles during the Cardiff half-marathon.

Jada: How many world records have you broken?

Ash: In total, I've broken 25 world records in 17 years, one of which was on live in China that over 50 million people have seen. Hopefully, I will continue to break more world records and inspire others.

Jada: Amazing! Have you ever met anyone you've been inspired by?

Ash: Yes, I am grateful that I've met, worked with and performed with many awesome footballers such as; Thiery Henry, Fernando Torres, Wayne Rooney and Pele. I was even invited to perform at a charity football match, where the band One Direction were performing their concert.

Jada: Wow! I would have loved to work with such amazing, inspiring people. Tell me about the wonderful places you've travelled to.

Ash: What can I say? I've had the opportunity of a liftetime. My career has taken me around the world. I have been to lots of stunning and remarkable places; China, Kuwait, USA, Canada nd Egypt were some of my favourites. I wish to continue travelling and show my skills to others around the world.

Jada: Thank you for visiting us today. It was amazing to hear that Queensgate was one of the 550 schools you've visited so far. All the children at Queensgate agree that it was a pleasure to see you. We are truly inspired!

Both classes had the opportunity of taking their parents to The Patch. Ben was on hand to assist in tree climbing and Mrs Dye used her Forest School training to good effect.



Out & About

Next half term, our Reception classes will be learning about the seaside. On Tuesday morning the **RAB** Out and About group visited St Helens Beach. The children enjoyed digging in the sand, collecting shells, transporting water with drain pipes and creating some amazing cakes and doughnuts in the 'sand kitchen'! At snack time the children listened to seaside stories whilst learning more about rock pools and different types of shells. It was super to see the children working and playing together on the beach.







On Tuesday afternoon the **Year 5** Out and About team walked from the Needles carpark up to the New Battery and High Down Testing Site. As part of their Science topic, *Space and Earth*, they learnt more about the Island's history and involvement in space travel, rocket manufacture and testing. The Black Knight and Black Arrow rockets (used to launch the Prospero Satellite) were designed in 1950s-1970s. Underground rooms at the New Battery were also used as part of the secret rocket testing. The group were all brilliant at walking up the steep chalk path to the downs!







After half term, the children in **Year 4** will be learning about Queen Victoria's impact on the Isle of Wight. On Wednesday morning the Out and About group from 4BM learnt about other influential Victorians that lived on the Island, including Julia Margaret Cameron and Alfred Lord Tennyson. The children walked from Freshwater Bay up to the monument at the top of Tennyson Down. We talked about Tennyson and his popularity as poet laureate during most of Queen Victoria's reign and how she met him on several occasions. The children all demonstrated great fitness and were in awe of the beautiful views of the bay and across the downs.







Out & About con't

All of 6LR went orienteering in Firestone Copse on Wednesday afternoon. The children used compasses and maps to navigate their way around the forest. They worked in two teams to find as many orienteering markers as they could within the time frame. Well done 6LR.







The Out and About after school club enjoyed the sunshine with a trip to Ryde beach on Wednesday. The children loved digging holes and playing in the sand.




