

Alex Rider has lots of super cool gadgets to help him complete his missions. Ashton would really like a watch like Alex's!


There are lots of books in this series. Come and have a look for them in our brilliant school library.

On Tuesday morning the **1CE** Out and About group went to Puckpool Park. The children were brilliant detectives, helping to find a lost teddy. They read and followed clues that lead them around the old battery, beach huts and park to find Ted. Afterwards, the children enjoyed a hot chocolate whilst we read the story *Dogger* by Shirley Hughes then had a play in the park together.



The **3PT** Out and About team walked across the fields and down to the Folly on Tuesday afternoon. The children loved climbing over the stiles and taking it in turns to lead the way. When we were by the river we talked about life in the Stone Age. Some children hunted for crabs, whilst others acted out Stone Age spear fishing and built a pretend fire, gathering washed up sticks. I was very lucky to be able to visit both Reception classes to share a story, poem and look at some information books to promote our local library and the Booktrust 'Time To Read' programme. The children were so interested and enthusiastic and behaved beautifully.

I was also able to have a whole school tour with Mrs Sillito to see how things had changed since my last visit in March 2020. It was lovely to see all the children working hard and proud of their school. They certainly seemed very settled, secure and happy - a credit to you all and the staff teams in such challenging times.

Until our new library building is ready we can be found at the Town Hall. Our times are limited, squeezed in between other users, but we are doing our best to keep going. Our children's books are all available for browsing, choosing and borrowing in these sessions. You can have a new book for bedtime every evening! The library is also a great way for children to try out different stories for free, with no obligation to finish if they don't like them. We also have a good range of information books. Craft, art, cookery, sports and animal care are very popular at the moment.

Adults are also able to borrow books but by ordering only. We will give you a call when your book arrives. Of course some adults come in to choose books for their children too.

OPTION 1

I AM ATTENDING THE BOOK FAIR IN PERSON AND WOULD LIKE TO PAY AT THE FAIR

On the Scholastic website, select 'I am paying at the Book Fair'. Enter your details, along with the total amount you are paying for your books. Once payment is complete, show your payment reference and the books you are purchasing to your Book Fair Organiser. Then, take your brand new books home!

OPTION 2

MY CHILD HAS ATTENDED THE BOOK FAIR AND ADDED **BOOKS TO THEIR WISH LIST. I WOULD LIKE TO PURCHASE** SOME/ALL OF THESE BOOKS

On the Scholastic website, select 'I am paying for books from a Wish List'. Enter your details, along with the total amount you are paying for your books. Once payment is complete, forward your payment reference and details of the books you have purchased to your Book Fair Organiser at school. They will arrange getting your brand new books to you!

OPTION 3

I AM UNABLE TO ATTEND THE BOOK FAIR, BUT WOULD LIKE TO PURCHASE BOOKS FROM THE BOOK FAIR INVITATION

On the Scholastic website, select 'I am unable to attend the Book Fair'. Type in the title of each book you'd like to purchase from the Book Fair Invitation and click 'Add'. Once you have finished adding your chosen books, click 'Confirm & pay' and enter your details. Once payment is received your books will be sent to the school for you to collect.*

Hot food stalls will be available.


Santa's grotto will be open from 4pm to 6pm.


