To prepare for their topic on the Stone Age next half term, they learnt the differences between history and pre-history and how maritime archaeologists can help us to understand how people may have lived in the Stone Age. The children got to handle 8,000 year old artefacts that were found by divers on the sea bed at Bouldnor, Yarmouth.



**Year 2** Out and About children visited the Garlic Farm, Newchurch, on Wednesday afternoon. They used their maps to follow the farm walk trail around the site and talked about how and where different foods grow.
