### Parts of the Human Body

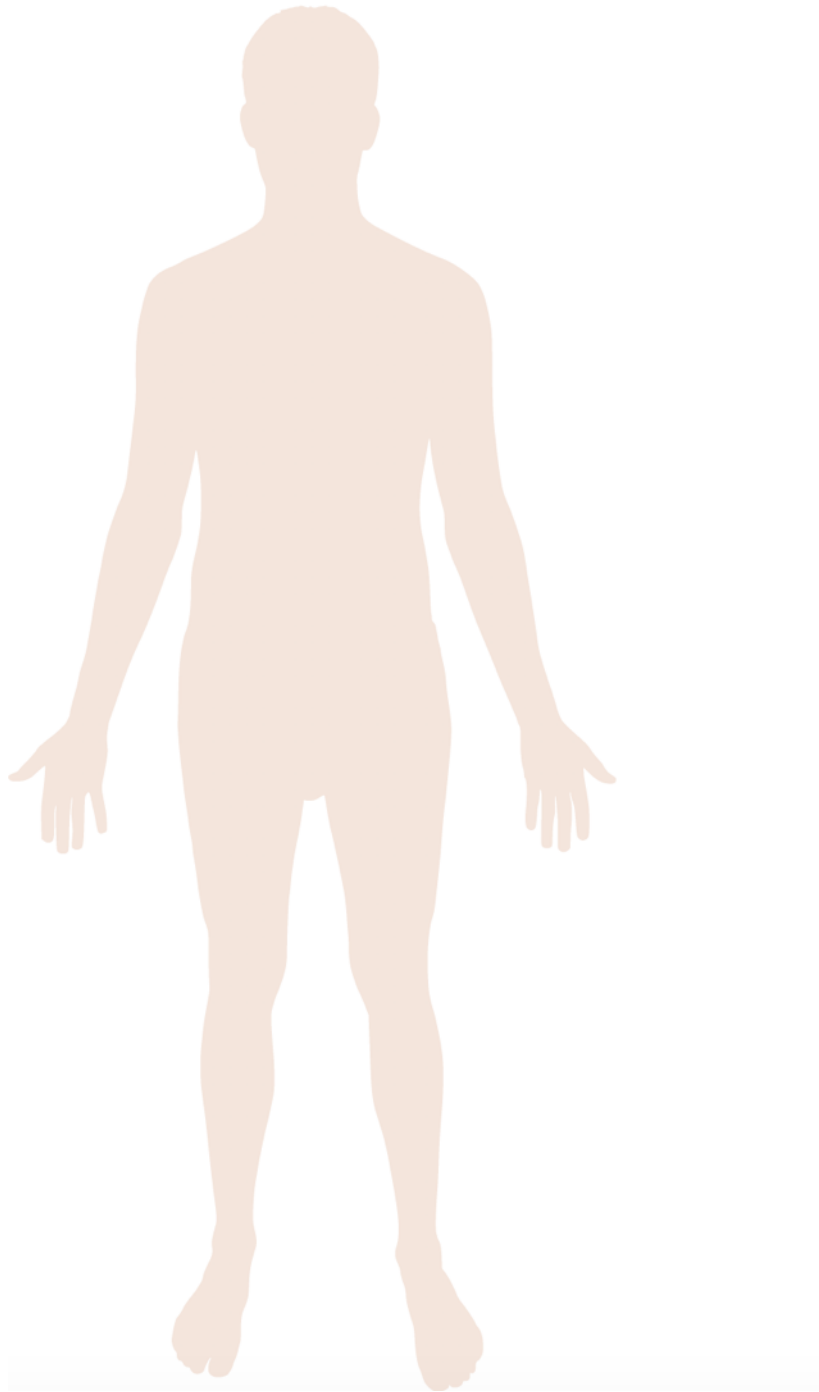
#### Activity: Draw around your body – and label it

If you have a hard area where you can do this safely outside, why not draw around your body in chalk (or ask a grown-up helper). If not, you could stick old newspaper sheets, or blank paper, together and draw around your body. Can you label different parts?

### Activity: Parts of the face

What senses do we use our nose, mouth, eyes and ears for?

### Activity: Play 'Simon says'

Play a game of 'Simon says', where one person gives instructions, such as:

- Simon says touch your nose
- Simon says bend your knees
- Simon says cross your legs
- Simon says pat your head
- Touch your ear (!)

And the other person/people do the action - but ONLY do the action IF the instruction starts with 'Simon says'. If you touched your ear (without 'Simon says'), you're out. Play again.
