Queensgate Out & About

On Tuesday morning, our **Year 2** Out and About children visited Nettlecombe Farm to support this term's Science learning about animal needs. The children learnt about the different animals (and variety of breeds) on the farm and had the opportunity to hand feed chickens, goats, sheep, alpacas, cows, and donkeys. It was really amazing to see the children supporting one another to develop confidence and get involved!







The children in **Year 4** are studying Charlie and the Chocolate Factory this half term. As part of their topic, the Out and About group visited The Isle of Wight Sweet factory at the Needles. The children learnt about the ingredients and process of making sweets and watched a demonstration using traditional machinery and methods from the early 19th century. The group were surprised by the high temperatures (approximately 150oC) that the granulated sugar, glucose syrup, and water needed to be heated to, to start the process.















Queensgate Out & About

On Wednesday, our **Year 3** Out and About team visited Yarmouth to learn about the River Yar. This half term they will be studying the topic of Rivers in Geography. The children enjoyed a (rather wet) walk along the riverside, identifying the key features. They sketched the estuary and used watercolour pencils to add colour to their work.







Our **Year 1** Out and About children used maps to explore the local area, during their session on Wednesday afternoon. The group identified where the school is on the map and followed a route to the seafront, stopping off at play parks on route. They talked about where they live as well as other friends and family. The children looked at different symbols on the OS maps and discussed key geographical features of East Cowes.





Working Together for a Successful Future



Dear parent/carer.

Your child's school has chosen to be part of an exciting initiative to encourage more children and their families to walk to school. **WOW** – **the walk to school challenge** is delivered by Living Streets, the UK charity for everyday walking, to help as many children as possible experience the benefits of walking to school.

The pupil-led challenge enables children to self-report how they get to school every day. If they travel actively (walk/wheel, cycle, scoot or Park and Stride) at least once a week for a month, they get rewarded with a badge. It's that simple!

What are the benefits of walking to school?

- Children feel happier and healthier
- They arrive to school refreshed and ready to learn.
- Helps reduce congestion and pollution at the school gates.

What if we can't walk to school?

If driving, 'Park and Stride' to help your child earn their WOW badges. Park at least ten minutes away from the school and walk the remaining journey.

If using public transport, hop off **at least ten minutes away** and walk the rest (recorded as 'other' on the WOW Travel Tracker).

Where walking to school isn't an option, we work with schools to establish a bespoke approach to WOW that works best for their pupils' needs.

What is a WOW badge?

There are 11 badges to be earned from September 2025 – July 2026. Each badge has been designed by a pupil as part of our annual WOW Badge Design Competition. A new badge can be earned every month if pupils walk/wheel, cycle, scoot, 'Park and Stride' or hop off at least once a week.

WOW 2025/26 encourages pupils to *Walk with Joy*, with badges depicting everything from jumping in puddles to painting

The badges are made in Cornwall from material that was otherwise destined for landfill, including fridge trays, plastic plates and yoghurt pot off-cuts. For more information, visit:
