## The Tiger Who Came to Tea



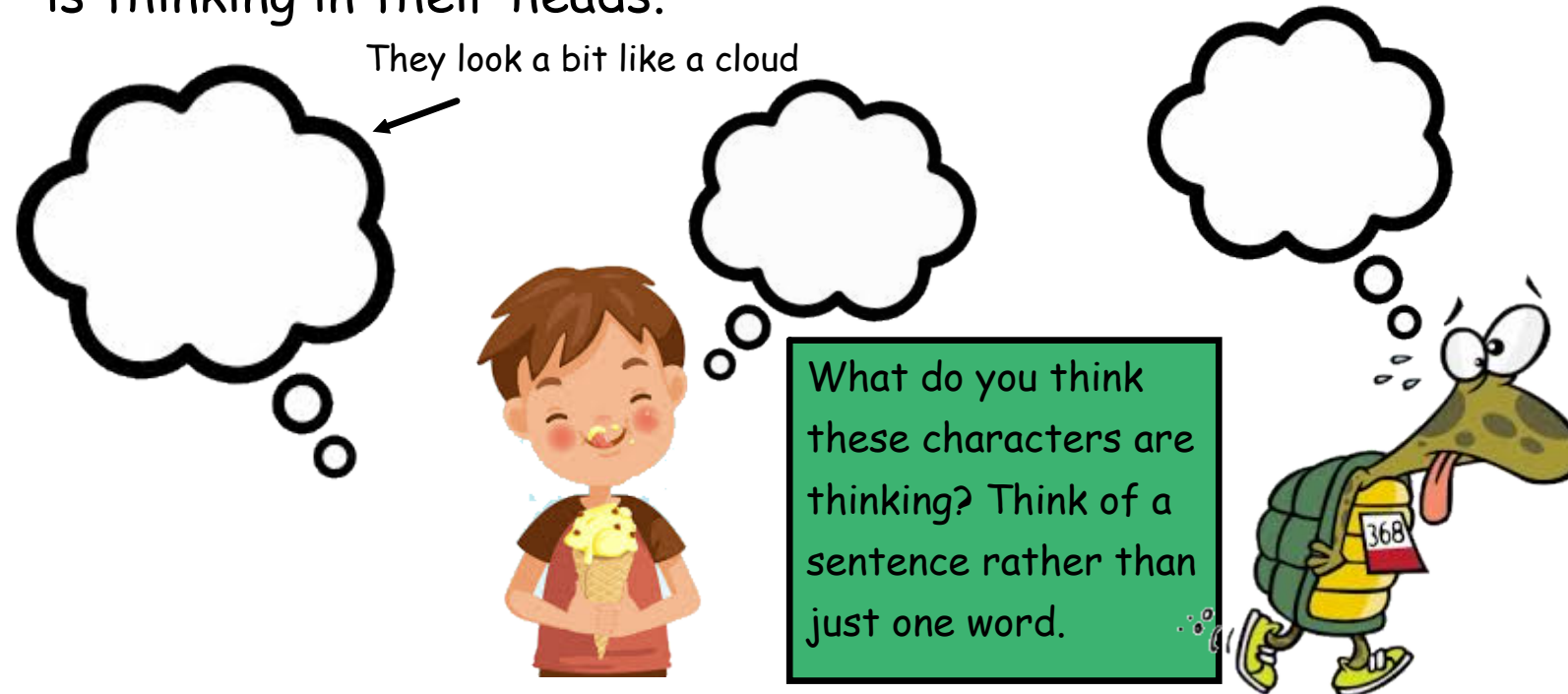

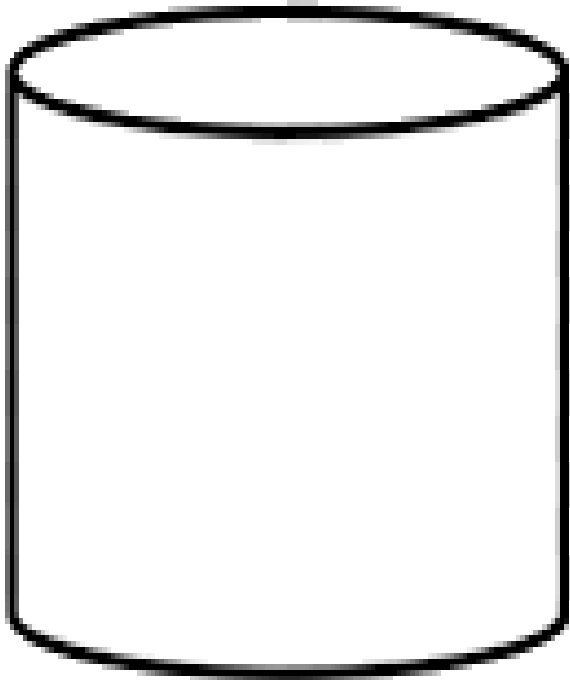

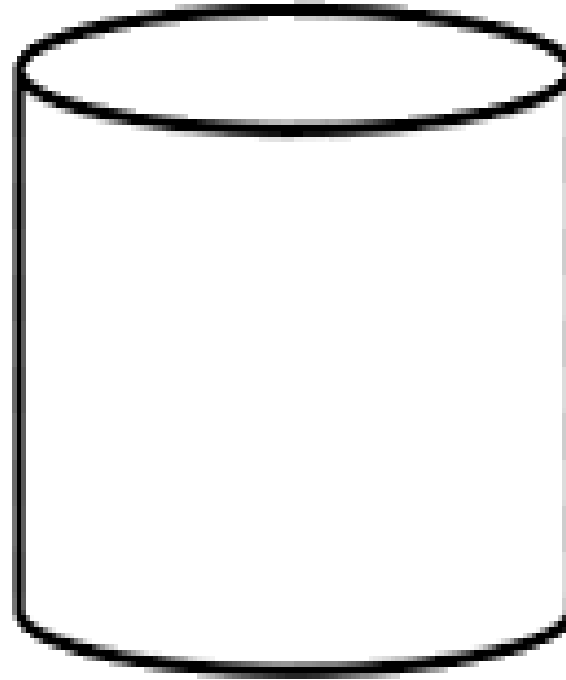

Wednesday- Today we are going to think of an animal we would like to invite to Tea.



Discuss with your adult which animal you would like to join you?

Discuss why they would be a good guest and why they wouldn't be a good guest.  
e.g.

A lizard would make a fun guest, using it's long tongue to snatch the food but it might start climbing up the walls which I wouldn't want.

After you have decided which animal you would like to have as a guest for tea, I would like you to design an invitation.



Use your imagination to design a wonderful tea party invite. Use the animal to inspire your designs- think about what they would like.

It is important that you include lots of useful information for your guest.

You need to tell them:

**When** the tea party is (date & time)

**Where** the tea party will be (place)

don't forget to write **who** it is to (animal) and **who** it is from (your name)

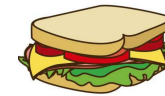
