
Today we are going to look at thought bubbles. They are like speech bubbles but they are telling us what a character in a story is thinking in their heads.

Your task today is to write a shopping list, maybe think about what you need in your house. Include 10 items.


Remember a list are words under each other, you do not need to write in a sentence or need full stops.

Use your imagination to design a wonderful tea party invite. Use the animal to inspire you designs- think about what they would like.


It is important that you include lots of useful information for your guest.
