Hook: Out and About/Habitats experiences

Rationale: The children will be given the opportunity to find out about the habitats that are present on the Isle of Wight, together with out and about experiences they will compare and learn about the wide range of plants and animals that exist.

Outcome:

To create an information book about a chosen habitat.

Focus Area: Science

- Recognise that living things can be grouped in a variety of ways.
- Explore and use classification keys to help group, identify and name a variety of living things in their local and wider environment.
- Recognise that environments can change and that this can sometimes pose dangers to living things.
