Invaders & & Settlers

Hook:

Young archeologists discovering artefacts in an ancient tomb.

Rationale:

We will be reading Beowulf and immersing ourselves in the legend.

The children will enter life as an Anglo-Saxon and unpick the oldest surviving English poem Beowulf.

Settlers and Invaders

Outcome: The children will create their own Anglo-Saxon compilation of discoveries.

Focus Area: Science - Materials - continued from Spring 1

Through a range of practical experiments pupils will be taught to:

- * Compare and group together everyday materials on the basis of their properties, including their hardness, solubility, transparency, conductivity (electrical and thermal), and response to magnets.
- * Know that some materials will dissolve in liquid to form a solution, and describe how to recover a substance from a solution.
- * Use knowledge of solids, liquids and gases to decide how mixtures might be separated, including through filtering, sieving and evaporating.
- * Give reasons, based on evidence from comparative and fair tests, for the particular uses of everyday materials, including metals, wood and plastic.
- * Demonstrate that dissolving, mixing and changes of state are reversible changes.
- * Explain that some changes result in the formation of new materials, and that this kind of change is not usually reversible.

Focus Area: English - Beowulf, by Michael Morpurgo

Through guided reading and English lessons, the pupils will read the book, exploring characters through drama and role play. Children will write letters of advice, character and setting descriptions and their own version of a legend or a missing chapter.

Supporting Focus Area: Art- Mixed material masterclasses

Pupils will be taught to develop their techniques, including their control and their use of materials, with creativity, experimentation and an increasing awareness of different kinds of art, craft and design.
