




Key Stage 1 & 2

Guided Listening Activity

We are going to listen to a 'Musical' sandwich by a famous composer Mozart.
It is call a 'musical' sandwich because it has a section that keeps coming back with different fillings in between.

The first tune you will hear played by the horn and then the orchestra is the first piece of bread.	
The next tune will be the first filling.	
Then you will hear the first tune with the horn and orchestra again	
After each piece of bread, there is a new filling.	
Then you will hear the first tune again	



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This kind of structure in music is called '**RONDO**' form.

1 How many pieces of bread are there in your sandwich? You may need to listen a couple of times to make really sure of your answer.

The listening activity was a concerto for French Horn.

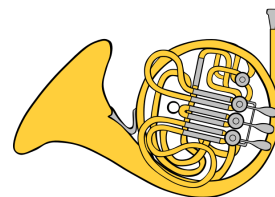

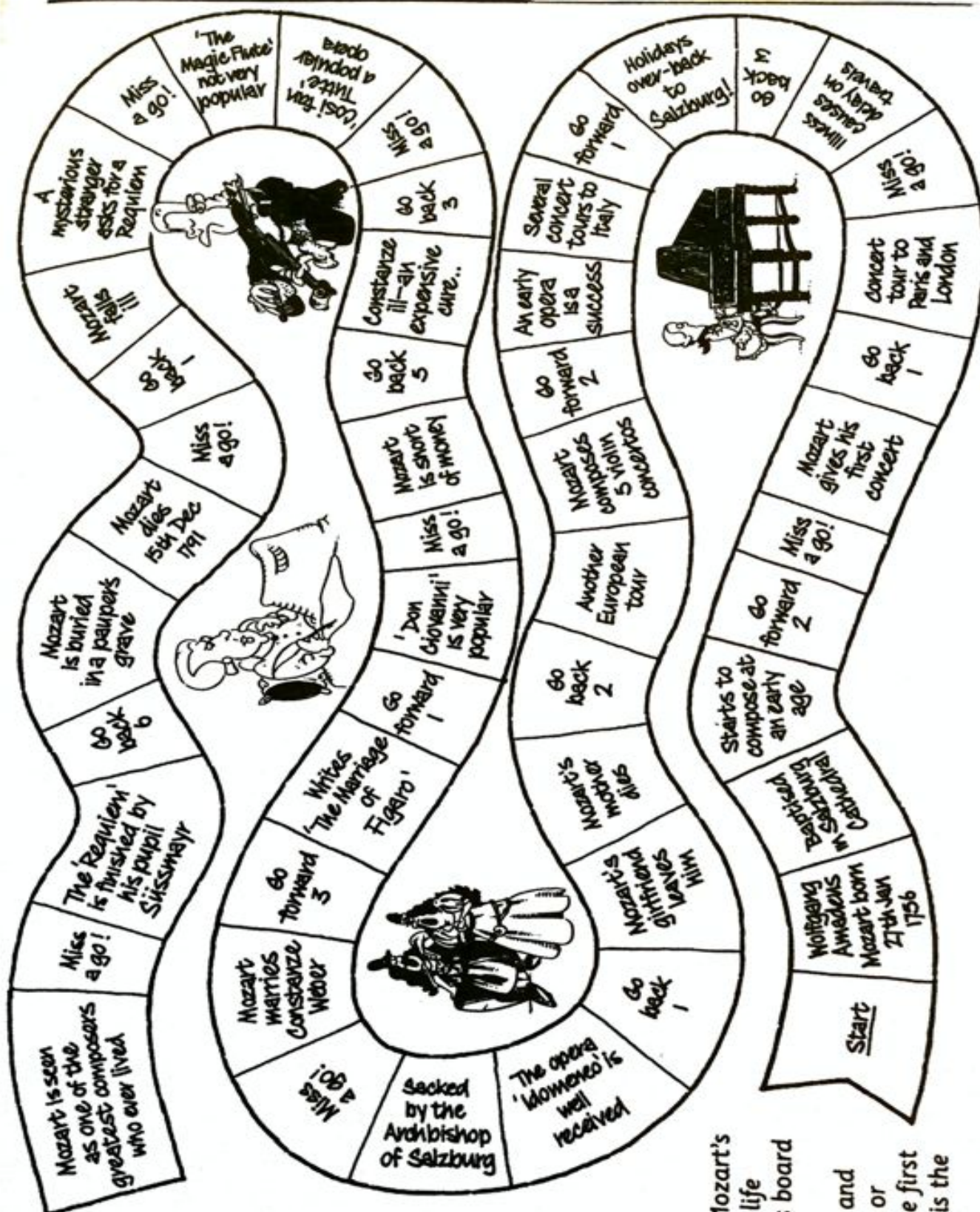
With your family, play the Travel with Mozart game. Along the route you will learn lots of interesting facts about Mozart. Have fun!
