Year 6 SATS

Next week is our Year 6s opportunity to shine. They have been working very hard all year. I was really pleased to give out certificates in last week's assembly to so many children who had achieved their highest scores in an arithmetic test - the timing couldn't be better! As a treat, and to set them up for their tests, we have invited all of them to attend breakfast club to enjoy a bacon baguette which you should have pre booked by now. I wish all of our Year 6s the very best of luck next week.

- Monday 12th May English grammar, punctuation and Spelling Paper 1: questions
- Monday 12th May English grammar, punctuation and spelling Paper 2: spelling
- Tuesday 13th May English reading
- Wednesday 14th May Mathematics Paper 1: arithmetic
- Wednesday 14th May Mathematics Paper 2: reasoning
- Thursday 15th May Mathematics Paper 3: reasoning

The tests are strictly administered but it is worth reminding parents that some children are given extra time, some have scribes, some have the option to have questions read to them (apart from the reading paper), some have coloured paper - this is all standard practise and we, as a school, have applied for these extra measures. Mrs Tuck (one of our governors) is an ex Head Teacher and will be coming into school to ensure that myself and the team are administering the tests correctly. It is also possible that we will get an unannounced visit from the Local Authority to check too.

To celebrate the end of SATs our Year 6s will be spending the day on Friday 16th May at East Cowes Seafront, where they will have an ice cream paid for by the money raised at their enterprise event last Friday.

Queensgate Out & About

The Reception Out and About team had a super time on Tuesday morning. The children have been learning all about different modes of transport. They visited Ryde Esplanade and spotted lots of vehicles, including buses, lorries, ferries and the hovercraft. The children then caught the train to Brading, where they enjoyed train stories on the platform, before heading back to Ryde.







- Although we are an outdoor activity centre we have an indoor education pavilion should it rain. But, we don't let rain put us off and recommend that children come prepared for all weathers.

A typical visit will commence with the coach dropping your children at the bus stop opposite Blackwater Mill care home where we will meet them and conduct a nature walk along the cycle track to our centre. Energy expended, children will be ready to have a really good learning experience.

After our safety talk children will either be split into 2 groups or groups of 6. Activities will be divided and after a hot chocolate/squash break in our woodland circle, groups will swap over.

We will return to the barn approx 12.30 where they will eat the packed lunch that they have brought with them. After lunch there will be a short playtime. We will go over what the children have learnt and then do an art activity (Day Diary) before returning along the cycle track to catch the coach back to school.

The Journey: Driving by mini bus? You can drive right up to the centre. We have a small car park. It can be arranged for parents to collect children from Naturezones at the end of the day. We have a small car park as we encourage car sharing. Please ask parents to turn off engines while waiting (CO2 emissions reduce)
