#### Sports News


After school today the Year 6 boys are in the football league final against Brading being held at Cowes. We wish them every success and hope they can bring yet another trophy back to Queensgate!

#### Year 6 SATs

As mentioned earlier the Year 6 will sit their SATs during the week beginning 12th May, here is the timetable:

The tests are strictly administered but it is worth reminding parents that some children are given extra time, some have scribes, some have the option to have questions read to them (apart from the reading paper), some have coloured paper - this is all standard practise and we, as a school, have applied for these extra measures. Mrs Tuck (one of our governors) is an x Head Teacher and will be coming into school to ensure that myself and the team are administering the tests correctly. It is also possible that we will get an unannounced visit from the Local Authority to check too.



### **Queensgate Out & About**

The children in Reception are learning all about transport this half term. To support their learning, the Out and About group enjoyed a train ride from Ryde Esplanade to Brading, on Tuesday morning. They enjoyed going through a tunnel, under bridges, changing platforms and meeting different train staff. The children loved spotting lots of different modes of transport in Ryde too and had fun watching the hovercraft arrive.













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On Tuesday afternoon, the Year 3 Out and About team walked along the river path of the Western Yar, in Yarmouth. This half term the children will be learning all about rivers within geography. The children noted features of the tidal estuary and had a go at using watercolour pencils to sketch the area.













To support the Year 1 topic of Planting and Growing, the Out and About children visited the Garlic Farm, in Newchurch, on Wednesday morning. The children used maps to follow a route around the farm. They learnt how garlic is planted in the Autumn (from a clove) and harvested in the Summer. The children had a great time playing frisbee golf in the woodland too!






