The evenings were finished off with songs around the campfire and a well deserved hot chocolate before heading to bed.

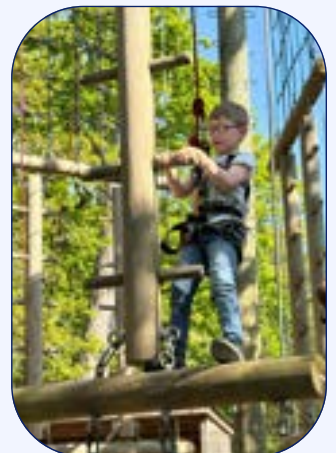
Well done Year 4!

Daisy "We had so many activities at PGL. My favourite was the problem solving."

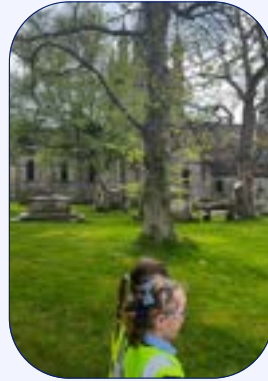
Tylan "My favourite thing was the 3G swing. It was a massive swing and me and my friend went to the very top."

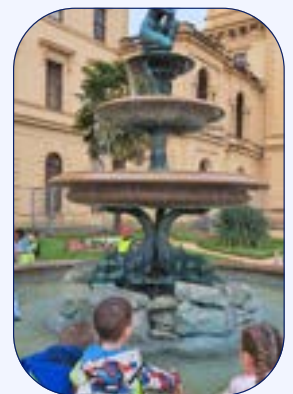
Reception walk to St Mildred's Church

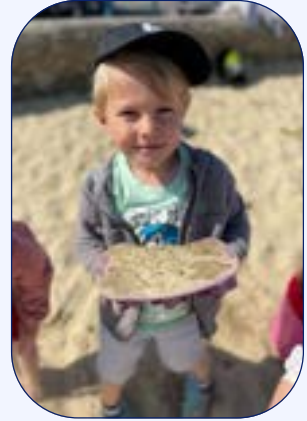

The tests are strictly administered but it is worth reminding parents that some children are given extra time, some have scribes, some have the option to have questions read to them (apart from the reading paper), some have coloured paper - this is all standard practise and we, as a school, have applied for these extra measures. Mrs Tuck (one of our governors) is an ex Head Teacher and will be coming into school to ensure that myself and the team are administering the tests correctly. It is also possible that we will get an unannounced visit from the Local Authority to check too.

Queensgate Out & About

On Tuesday morning, our Reception Out and About team visited Ryde beach. The children enjoyed gathering shells, paddling in the sea, digging holes, building sandcastles, and making some amazing cakes and ice creams in their sand-kitchen! It was wonderful to see all the children playing together, taking turns and busy exploring.



The Year 3 Out and About group walked along the Western Yar, on Tuesday afternoon. The children have begun their topic on rivers and discussed the features of the tidal estuary. They all took great care to sketch the view from the riverbank in Yarmouth, using watercolour pencils to add colour to their work.

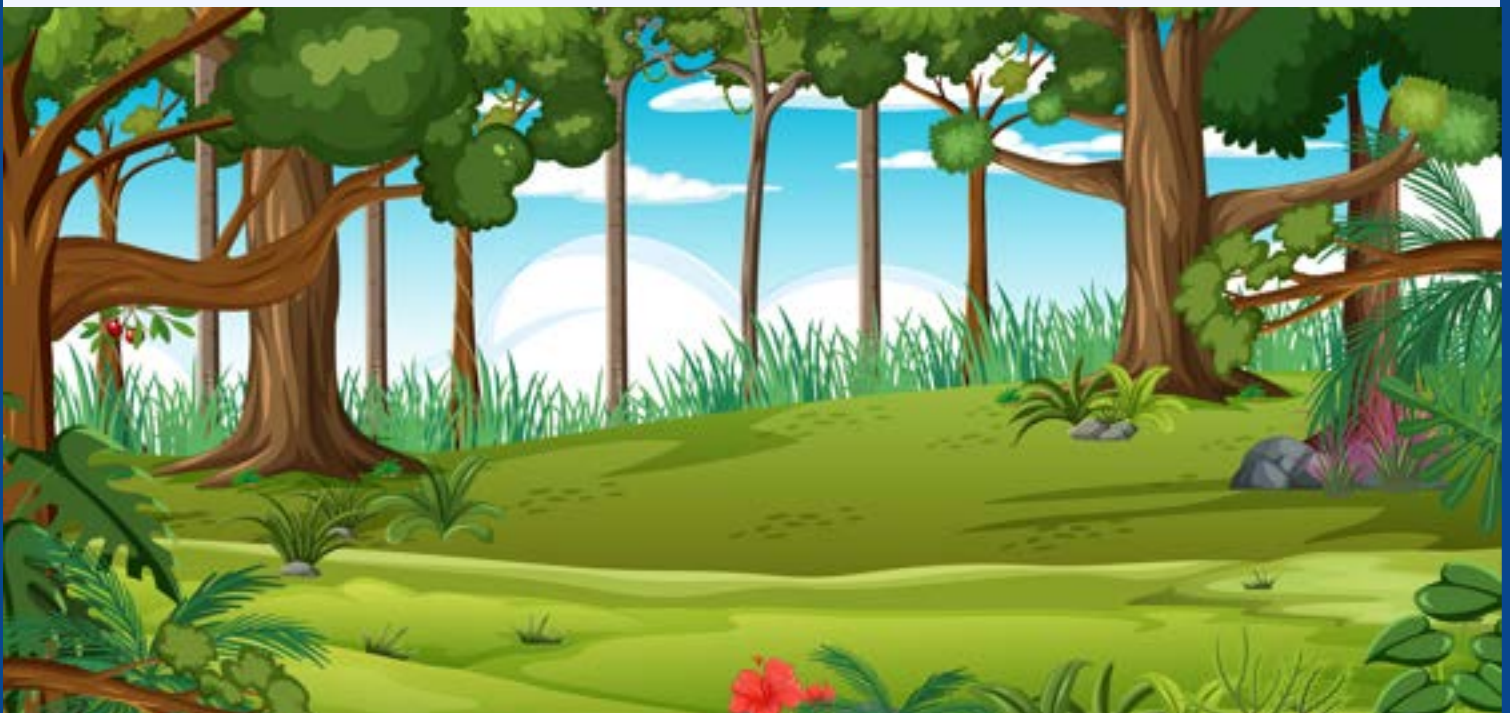

- Naturezones provides a safe environment for your children
- Our instructors are CRB checked and have 15 years experience in running school visits at our Field Study Centre
- We are fully public liability insured
- We work with children from reception to yr 6
- Although we are an outdoor activity centre we have an indoor education pavilion should it rain. But, we don't let rain put us off and recommend that children come prepared for all weathers.
- Toilet facilities

A typical visit will commence with the coach dropping your children at the bus stop opposite Blackwater Mill care home where we will meet them and conduct a nature walk along the cycle track to our centre. Energy expended, children will be ready to have a really good learning experience.

After our safety talk children will either be split into 2 groups or groups of 6. Activities will be divided and after a hot chocolate/squash break in our woodland circle, groups will swap over.

We will return to the barn approx 12.30 where they will eat the packed lunch that they have brought with them. After lunch there will be a short playtime. We will go over what the children have learnt and then do an art activity (Day Diary) before returning along the cycle track to catch the coach back to school.

The Journey: Coming by mini bus? You can drive right up to the centre. We have a small car park. It can be arranged for parents to collect children from Naturezones at the end of the day. We have a small car park so we encourage car sharing. Please ask parents to turn off engines while waiting (CO2 emissions initiative)

I hope this letter finds you well. I am writing to inform you of upcoming changes to our school hours, designed to align with updated government guidance. The Department for Education has issued guidance to help schools in England that currently offer a school week below 32.5 hours to meet the minimum expectation announced in the Schools White Paper in March 2022.

Currently, our school day runs from 8:30am to 2:45pm, meaning we fall 35 minutes short of this requirement each week.

After careful consideration, the academy's Senior Leadership Team and Ormiston Academies Trust have developed a proposal that will support school improvement priorities and enhance student learning outcomes. To comply with this directive, we will be making a small adjustment to our timetable.

Beginning from September 2025, the new school hours will be:

Time	Activity
8:30 – 9:00	Tutor Period
9:00 – 10:00	Period 1
10:00 – 11:00	Period 2
11:00 – 11:20	Morning Break
11:20 – 12:20	Period 3
12:20 – 1:00	Lunch
1:00 – 14:00	Period 4
14:00 – 15:00	Period 5

This adjustment ensures compliance with government guidance while maintaining a structure similar to our current schedule, with an additional 15 minutes at the end of the day.

Consultation Period:

We value your input and welcome your feedback regarding this adjustment. The consultation period will be open from 5th May to 30th May 2025. If you have any comments or concerns, please share them via email at info@cowes.org. We will carefully consider all responses during the consultation period, and a final decision will be communicated in June.

We appreciate your continued support and aim to provide parents and carers with as much notice as possible ahead of the adjustment in September 2025.

Occupational therapy Parent advice sessions

The NHS Occupational Therapy Team will be running monthly parent advice sessions. These sessions are open to any families which don't have an existing referral.

- Self Care tasks - e.g. washing, dressing, using cutlery, toileting
- Fine motor skill development
- Play skills
- Preschool / school readiness
