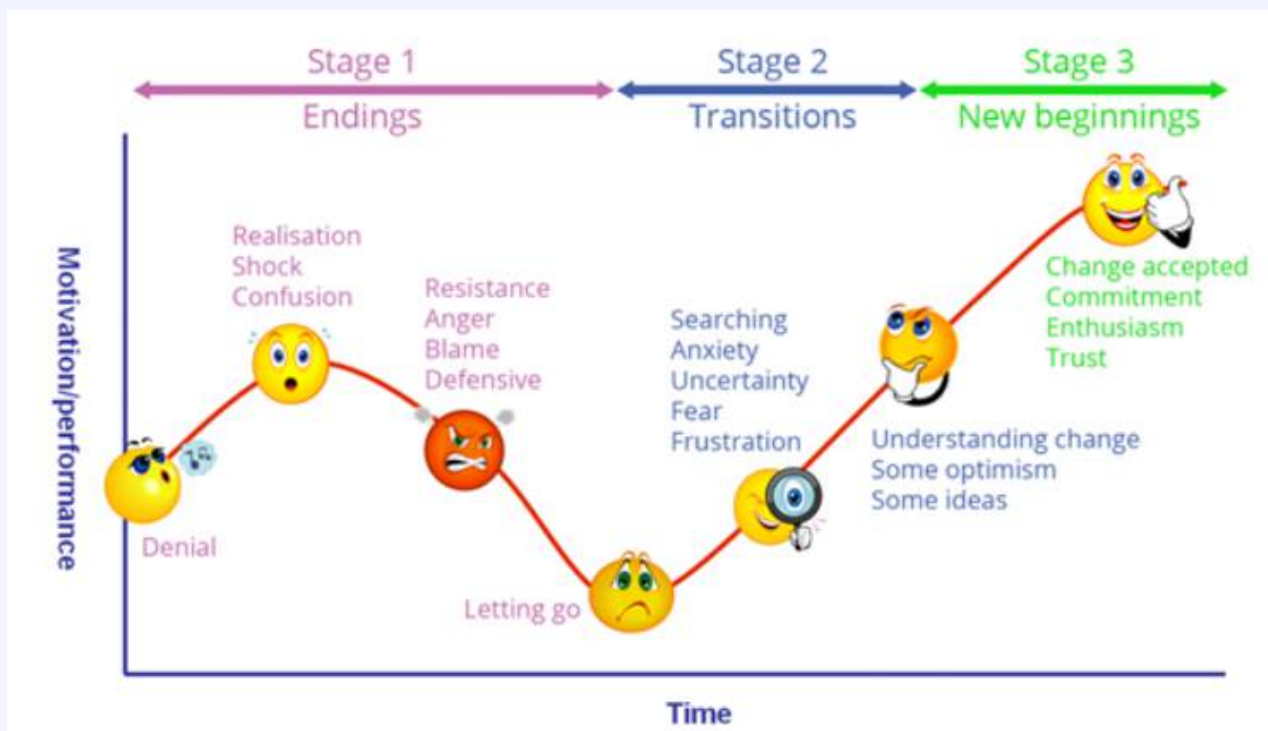

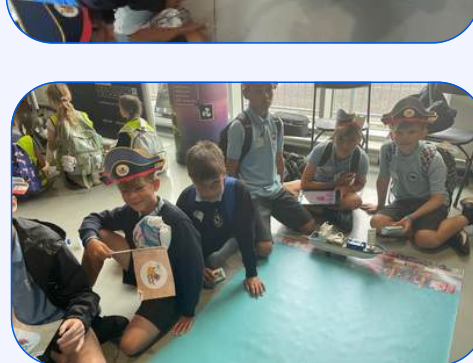
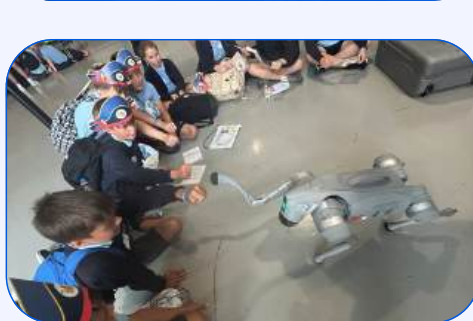
Ocean Stem Day

World Record Attempt

On Tuesday a group of children took part in Jamie Oliver's pasta for champions. We joined a live zoom to follow one of Jamie's chefs to make a delicious pasta recipe. We even made our very own pasta!

This was an attempt to get in the Guinness Book of World Records to see how many children we could get cooking at one time.

The children were incredible as no help was allowed to be given from the adults in the room. They followed the live zoom incredibly well and managed to keep in time with all the instructions given. Their pasta making skills were amazing and they learnt how to make different types of pasta shapes which were pici and gnocchetti. The children had so much fun making these shapes although they had to work quickly.

The children made a no cook tomato based sauce using fresh ingredients. They demonstrated excellent chopping skills throughout.

At the end of the session the children were able to eat the delicious pasta they made and they all really enjoyed it.

Adeline said "I enjoyed myself and making the pasta was fun we used eggs and flour to make a dough and made pasta shapes. My favourite shape to make was gnocchetti, we used the back of the fork to roll our dough down to make a shape. We cut tomatoes and basil to make a delicious pasta sauce. It tasted fantastic – I have taken the recipe home to make it again!"

George said "First we made the dough, then we started kneading the dough. Then we made the tomato sauce, then we made the dough into different shapes, we could either make pici or gnocchetti shapes, pici was my favourite shape to make it was easy! We then cooked the pasta, once it started to cook it expanded. Then we put the pasta in to the tomato sauce and mixed together ready to eat. I added extra salt for seasoning. It was very delicious and refreshing."



Queensgate Out & About

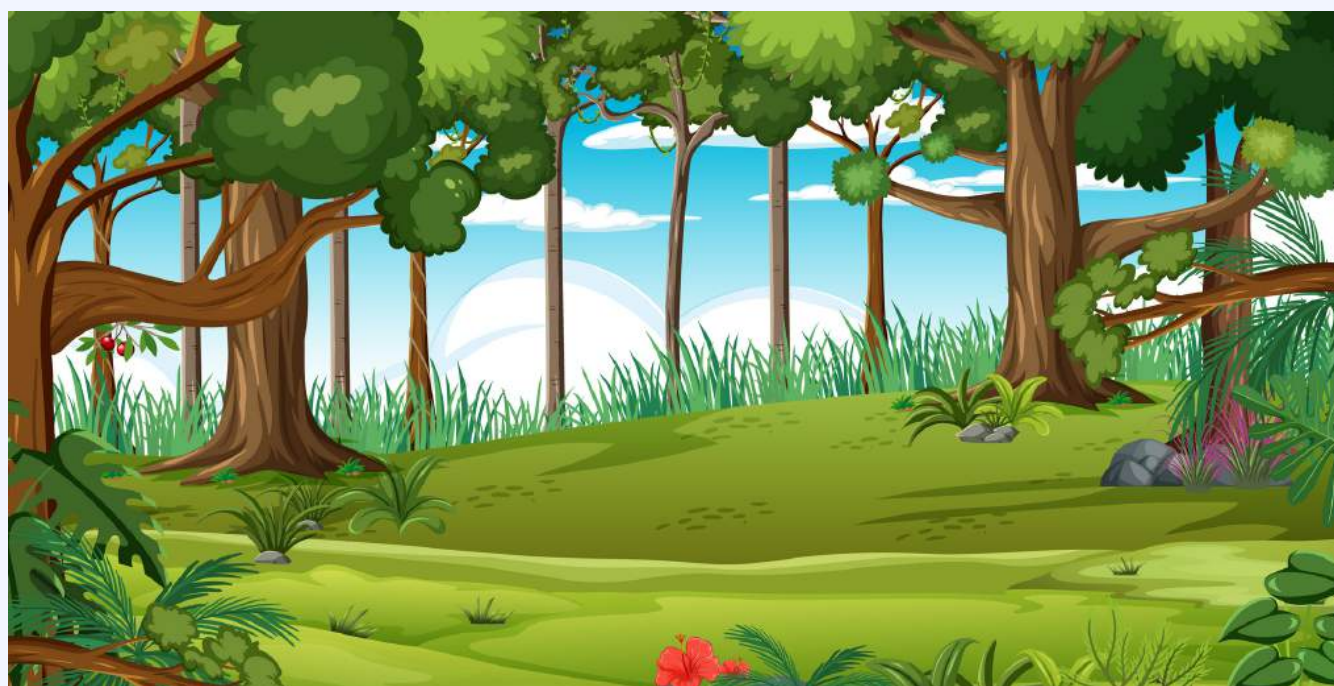
In Year 1, the children have been learning about the heroic story of Grace Darling and the role of lighthouses. This week our Out and About team visited The Needles pleasure park and walked down to Alum Bay. The children learnt about the Needles lighthouse and listened to lighthouse themed stories on the beach. They were amazed that it has a helipad on the top of it and fascinated by the coloured sands within the cliffs.



On Tuesday afternoon, our Year 3 Out and About children visited Godshill play-park to explore forces in action, as part of their current Science topic. Most of the children hadn't visited the park so they had fun exploring the new equipment. They worked in pairs to identify if a push or pull force was changing which way an object moved. It was a warm afternoon, so the children enjoyed ice-pops to cool down!



In Science, our Year 2s have been learning about the importance of, and impact of, exercise on our bodies. The Out and About group visited Culver Down, where they recorded their resting heart rate using a pulse oximeter. The children then walked down to Whitecliff Bay, enjoyed a play on the beach, before the steep walk back up to the minibus. They re-tested their pulse rate when they got back to the bus. The group confidently discussed why it had increased and explained that their heart had to beat faster to pump the oxygen in their blood to their muscles!

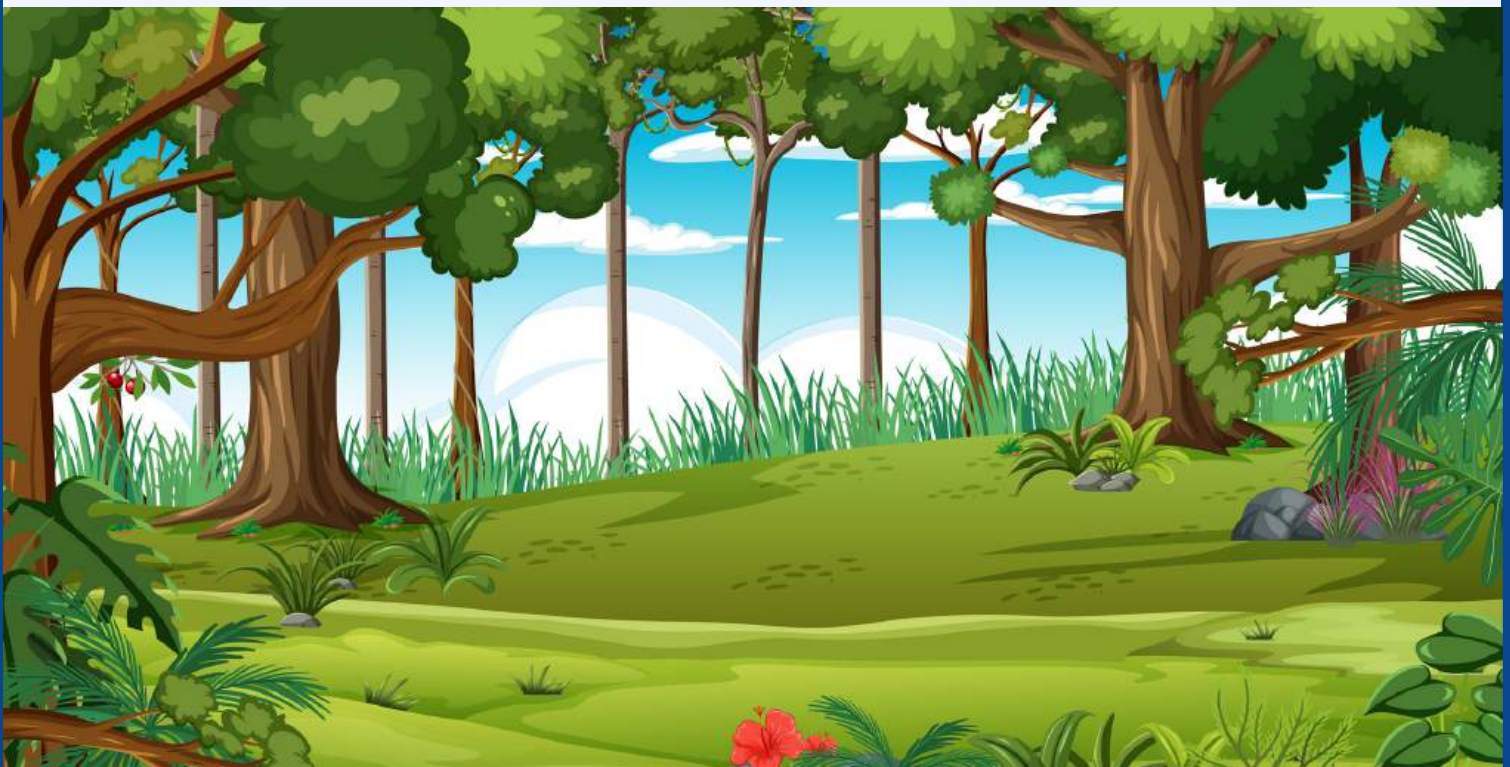

NHS 111 Online & Local Pharmacies

NHS 111 online and local pharmacies can help you get the right care

People with urgent but non-life-threatening medical needs are encouraged to use NHS 111 online to get quick advice and be directed to the most appropriate care, especially over the bank holiday weekend when services are expected to be busy.

NHS 111 online is a fast and easy-to-use alternative to the NHS 111 phone service. It can provide help for people 5 years and over by assessing symptoms, giving advice on what to do next, and connecting people to local services without having to wait on the phone.

Whether you need help with a minor injury, mental health support, advice about dental pain, or emergency medication, NHS 111 online is available 24/7. It's especially useful if you can't get a GP appointment or your surgery is closed.

Sophia from Newport recently searched 111.nhs.uk for help when she woke up with red, itchy insect bites after a family BBQ. When they started getting worse, she used NHS 111 online for advice and was directed to her local pharmacy. The pharmacist recommended a cream and gave her tips on managing the symptoms including what to do if the bites got worse.

Sophia said: "I was glad I went online first. A friend suggested I go to hospital but that didn't feel right for a few bites. The pharmacy was exactly what I needed."

Lee Haward, IW Ambulance Service Head of Clinical Coordination Centre, said: "If you've got access to the internet, NHS 111 online is a really quick and easy way to get help. It works just like calling 111, but you can do it all online, anytime, day or night. Just go to the NHS 111 website or use the NHS App, answer a few questions about how you're feeling, and it will guide you to the right care. It's really easy to use and there when you need help."

Pharmacies can help with minor illnesses - Your local pharmacy is also a great source of expert help for minor conditions. As part of the Pharmacy First scheme, many community pharmacies can now offer clinical advice and treatment for common illnesses without the need to see a GP:

Sinusitis

Sore throat

Earache

Infected insect bites

Impetigo (a bacterial skin infection)

Shingles

Uncomplicated urinary tract infections (in women)

Pharmacists are qualified healthcare professionals who can provide advice, reassurance, and treatment options, often with no need for an appointment. Many pharmacies will remain open over the bank holiday weekend. You can find a list of pharmacies online

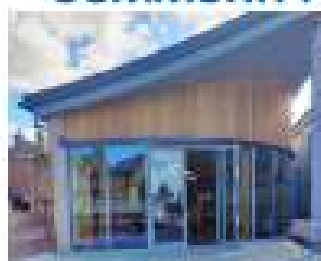

Additionally, many of our tutors provide programmes of extra-curricular music in support of schools, the Isle of Wight Music Centre, and to community music groups.



It goes without saying that all our teachers have had enhanced DBS checks carried out and have completed training in the safeguarding of children to at least level 2. But at Wight Music Tuition we believe it important to maintain the quality of service that children, schools and parents deserve. That's why we run, in partnership with the Isle of Wight Music Education Hub, a programme of professional development, to keep us up to date with modern teaching, and why we all voluntarily submit to undergo lesson observations and inspections of our teaching by experienced external assessors.

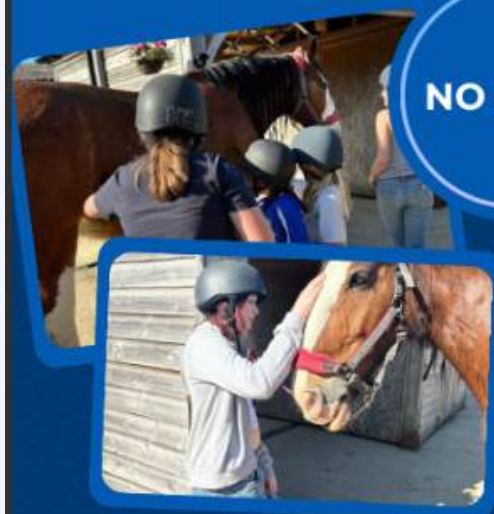
