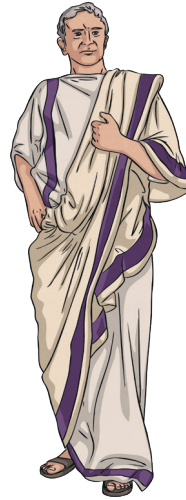

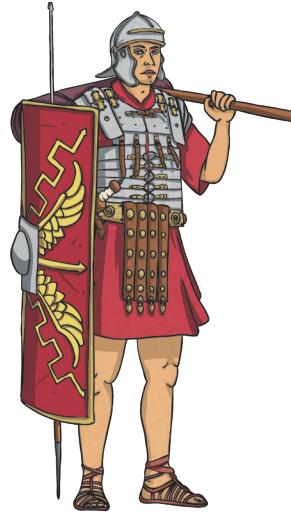


**Equestrians**
