Hook:

Children will use maps, plans and aerial photos to explore seasides, including East Cowes and the local area.

Rationale:

Finish Date: 17.07.2020

The pupils will use observation, reasoning and research to explore differences at the seaside between the present and the past.

Outcome:

Pupils will know some ways in which seaside holidays in the past were different to our experience of the present.

Children will draw a plan of their ideal school play area.

They will look at maps, plans and aerial photos of their local area. They will use a key and map symbols.

Focus Area: History

- Seasides in the Past

Pupils will identify differences between ways of life at different times. They will use a range of sources to ask and answer questions about the past. They will present their opinions in a variety of ways, for example: drawing and writing. Pupils will find out about Queen Victoria's Island Holiday home. They will investigate the history of the seaside and holidays.
