
















### The Height of the Roman Empire

This map shows the country boundaries as they were in 177AD.


Have a look in your atlas. Which countries as we know them today had been conquered by the Romans.



### Task


On a blank map of Europe, show with colour how much land the Romans had conquered by 177AD.
