2] Have you managed to read all of the 'Beasts of Olympus' so far (chapter 1 and the beginning of chapter 2? The work below is based on the text; the tasks are to do with prefixes, suffixes and some punctuation work......

Prefixes and suffixes;

There are many words that can either have extra letters in front (prefix) or have extra letters at the end (suffix). The main word we call the ROOT.

Examples; Unclear - clear is root word, un-is the prefix. Singing - sing is the root word and - ing is the suffix.

When we add a prefix or suffix, it can change the meaning of the word - look at clear and unclear.

Some words might have a prefix and a suffix.

TASK 1: - look for words with PREFIXES and underline/highlight. Check the root word.
