

## Year 2 Home Learning - Summer Term - Week 3, 4<sup>th</sup> May 2020

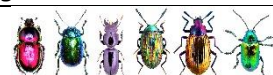
Hello,

<b>English</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Our work for 'The Twits' continues with the tricks. This week we are thinking about how they react when they have a trick played on them. There are <b>3 tasks</b> that should take about 30 minutes each. Please read the instructions carefully as you work through, as there are some very important things to remember for when you do your writing.</li></ul> <p><b>Reading comprehension</b> - there are 2 reading tasks this week - 'Beach habitats' and 'What do doctors do?' Both have 3 different versions. Please choose the level that is best for you and answer the questions. <b>Topic</b>	'Darwin the Discoverer' voyages around the world, exploring new countries and finding new creatures. We look at life on board a sailing ship almost 200 years ago.
<b>Art/DT</b>	See the page of colourful beetles. Have a go at drawing, colouring, painting, making your own.
