Reading	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• To regularly read a wide range of age appropriate books/ texts for pleasure.• Fiction and non-fiction- newspapers, novels, magazines, fact books, instructions, top trumps cards etc• To be able to talk about what they have read and practise dictionary skills to look up and discuss new words that may crop up in text. To write an alternative ending to your book.
