We hope you have enjoyed looking at your Habitats Booklet and have worked through some of the activities. Hopefully, you have identified some of the main types of habitat we have in the UK and noticed some of the animals and plants that can be found in each area.

Habitat Home to:

Woodland - deer, foxes, badgers, woodmice, wood ants Seashore - seagulls, crabs, seaweed, limpets, fish River - otters, water voles, fish, reeds, ducks Field- butterflies, harvest mice, grass, flowers

Tree - owls, dormice, moss, red squirrel frogs, dragonflies, pondweed, irises

Leaf - caterpillars, aphids

Underneath a log - woodlice, beetles, slugs, centipedes

The task we would like you to complete, over the next 2 weeks, is to choose 1 habitat from the list above and to research plants and animals that live there. You can use the list above to start you off but use the internet, books or field study visits to one of the habitats to add information.

Think about the different types of animal live there and find out what they eat, where they sleep and how they hide in their habitat.

Also, think about how weather and humans can have a negative impact on the environment- specifically the habitat you have chosen. What might the impact of that be on the animals and plants that thrive there?

Use your artistic skills to draw, paint or collage the habitat then add the information your research has uncovered. Why not create fact-files, information bubbles or have lift up flaps to reveal the facts?
