Reading	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• To regularly read a wide range of age appropriate books / texts for pleasure• Fiction and non-fiction- newspapers, novels, magazines, fact books, instructions, top trumps cards etc• Use kindles, audio books or online texts• To be able to talk about what they have read and practise the skills of inference (using the clues), skimming (getting the gist of what the text is about) and scanning (finding key words)
Writing	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• To be able to spell all of the words on the Year 3 and 4 spelling list - available on the link below: https://cdn.oxfordowl.co.uk/2019/08/29/13/54/08/76f1443d-9b6d-4030-be0d-25fcfef01438/SpellingWordList_Y3-4.pdf• To be able to use each of the spelling words in accurately punctuated sentences that make sense• Keep a diary or journal about what you are doing each day - think about the 'fantastics' and include how you feel, what you did, what you thought about it and what you wished you could have been doing!• Write your own stories.
