Hook:

All pupils will explore a range of ancient Greek artefacts, asking questions and finding out the facts behind the curiosities and exhibits.

Rationale:

Throughout the theme, pupils will learn about different cultures, old and new and will search for similarities and differences. They will explore the complexities of the ancient Greek civilization and the legacy it has left behind and they will investigate the geographical and social aspects of modern-day life. Key themes will include home-life, laws and education, religion, hobbies and geography.

Focus Area: History - Ancient Greece

Pupils will use artefacts, books, computers and film clips to complete a study of Greek life and the achievements and influence on the western world.

They will investigate the notions of civilisation, democracy, architecture, religion and empire.

Pupils will be encouraged to ask questions about the lifestyle of people in ancient Greece and compare it to their own experiences as well as identifying features of our modern lives which are directly influenced by the civilisation of ancient Greece.

The Life Cycle of Animals and Plants

Pupils will learn how to explain the differences in the life cycles of mammals, amphibians, insects and birds,

Children will create a range of artwork, inspired by the story naval architect Blanche Thornycroft, which will be displayed at the Classic Boat Museum.
