

New entrance and pick up arrangements

On the reverse of this you will find a map showing suggested entry points for each year group. This is slightly different to previous detail in recent newsletters.

We would kindly request that for children in **Reception, Year 3 and Year 4** please come to school via Beatrice Avenue and through the car park (as previously shown in recent newsletters), you will then walk up past the old hall and see the front of the new build—there are new steps and an accessible path slightly further up. Reception children will then walk in front of the new building and wait in their area highlighted on the map. Year 3 and Year 4 children will head up the side of the building and enter the school by the stair doors - no parents will be allowed past this door for safeguarding and safety reasons.

Children from **Year 1, Year 2, Year 5 and Year 6** will access the school site from Beatrice Avenue via the pathway leading to Seashells. You will then enter through the double green gates and a pathway will lead you to the current ramp and a new set of stairs taking you up to the left of the building. Year 5 and Year 6 will enter by the stair doors - again no parents will be allowed past this point. Year 1 and Year 2 parents need to continue up the left hand side of the building until they reach the playground outside of Year 1 and Year 2 classes. Please drop your children at the door (again no access to the classrooms will be permitted).

If you have more than one child, it will probably be worth working out the easiest route for children to get to their entry points, but probably taking younger children first would be advisable.

Pick up - please note the designated waiting areas. The children will be brought to the classroom doors from Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 and to the side doors for the other year groups. During the day access to the office will be via the car park entrance only.

Please remember your opportunity to view the inside of the building happens on Friday 28th February - in the times stated in the last newsletter.
