Following the announcements last weekend we have added to our Covid protection measures by requesting all staff and visitors to the school wear masks in communal areas. This is in addition to the measures outlined in last week's newsletter.

Christmas Events Update

At this time we have decided to go ahead with our **Reception Christmas Nativity at 9:30 on Wednesday 15**th **December.** The doors will be open so wrap up warm! Only two people per family please and we ask that you wear masks. The thinking behind this decision is that Reception children often work together as a year group and we are only inviting one year group of parents, so we are not mixing across the school.

Christmas lunch

Christmas lunch for the children will also go ahead. We think it is important for the children to have these celebrations and enjoy their Christmas lunch. Year groups will be kept on different tables – this is currently how lunchtimes are organised so it will not be too different from normal. Please remember the children can wear their Christmas jumper on this day **Thursday 16**th **December.**

Christmas Carol Service in the Church — we have decided not to go ahead with this event. The reason for this is that when the whole of our school goes to the Church it is a tight squeeze. The windows do not open and I do not feel that there will be adequate ventilation. In addition it would be mixing the whole school up together and we know that singing is a way of spreading Covid 19 due to more particles being in the air. I think this is too big a risk to take so close to Christmas. We do not want anyone to have Covid 19 over Christmas. Sorry for any disappointment caused.

Christmas Party day on Monday 20th December – we have decided to go ahead with this. The parties will be in the classrooms and therefore the children will not be mixing across the school.

Christmas Tree

Some of our Reception children went along with Mrs Johnson and Mr Palin to get our Christmas tree. They lent a hand choosing the tree, getting it wrapped up for transportation and getting it into the school. Great job!









Attendance

Our attendance currently stands at 93.9% which is very low indeed for us. I was interested to learn that the attendance for the Isle of Wight schools is currently 91% and nationally school attendance is at 89%. It is really important that your child attends school as much as possible. It is pleasing to see that Queensgate is above the Isle of Wight and National attendance rates. Many children have many gaps in their learning, so please send them to school unless they are unwell. Please remember to read with them every day, chat to them, play with them and practise their times tables.




Then try this....

Out & About

On Tuesday the **1CE** group of Out and About children had a very busy morning. They used their phonic knowledge to read and follow clues around Puckpool Park to find another lost teddy! The children worked well as a team and demonstrated confident reading skills. After finding Teddy, they had a play in the park, hot chocolate and stories. On our way back to school, we were honoured with the job of buying the school Christmas tree. The tree is now on display in the dining room for all children to see.







The Out and About team from **3BM** visited the Shipwreck Centre at Arreton Barns on Tuesday afternoon. The children continued their learning on the Stone Age as they learnt about Maritime Archaeology and the discovery of a Stone Age town under the sea at Bouldnor Cliffs, near Yarmouth. The children were able to handle and help categorize 6,000 year old artefacts that had been found off the coast of the Island.







On Wednesday morning the Out and About group from **4MC** went to Yaverland Beach. The children were challenged to design and create their own Egyptian themed sand sculptures. They looked at the work of artists Andy Goldsworthy and James Brunt for inspiration before they got creating. The children explained their knowledge of Ancient Egypt, choosing to make pyramids, Sphinx, the river Nile and using hieroglyphics within their work.







Year 2 are currently learning about the history of flight. To support their topic, the **2KA** Out and About children visited the Wight Aviation Museum at Sandown Airport. The children learnt about the different types of aircraft, the very first aeroplanes invented, the Black Arrow R3 rocket launch and the life of Mary Ellis. They took part in activities and were given a tour of the museum by keen and knowledgeable volunteers. We even got to look at some real planes in one of the hangars, identifying the key parts of aeroplanes.







In Out and About Club after school, the children enjoyed making a fire on the Patch, toasting marshmallows and eating s'mores as well as creating some more Christmas tree decorations.




