Sports Report

Year 6 girls Tag Rugby

Last week a team from Year 6 went along to a girl's tag rugby competition in Wootton. They played multiple teams from schools across the Island. This gave the girls vital experience of playing competitively as well meeting other children. The girl's progression across the competition was incredible, getting better and better with each match.

Year 6 boys Football

On Tuesday a team from Year 6 played a football match against The Bay Primary school. This team were difficult opponents; however, our boys showed more resilience than imaginable. They played their very best for the entire game, never giving up despite the overall loss at full time. The boys certainly did Queensgate proud with their inspiring sportsmanship.

Year 5 and 6 Mixed Tag Rugby

On Wednesday two teams represented Queensgate in tag rugby. The A team consisted of Year 6 boys whilst the B team was a mixed team of experienced Year 6 players and Year 5 players who were playing tag rugby matches for the first time. Both teams played really well in their five games with the A team playing confidently and consistently and the B team showing great improvement with each game they played. The A team finished joint first and will go on to represent Queensgate at the Island Tag finals on the 19th October. The B team finished joint 5th. As the tournament was held at Queensgate, it was great to see some of the younger pupils come out to show their support and hopefully be inspired by the older pupils.



Year 6 Boys Football

Last Monday, the Year 6 boys travelled to Carisbrooke for their first league game of the year. The squad was rotated from their previous game and were hopeful to be as successful as last time out. The game kicked off and the boys unfortunately started slow. Despite this, the boys battled hard throughout the first half and went into the half time break with Carisbrooke leading 1-0. At half time we spoke as a team about being defensively stronger and using the width when going forward. As the second half begun, the boys seemed to come out much stronger, creating a few chances for themselves. However, this wasn't enough to secure any league points as the boys went on to lose the game 4-1. This wasn't the team's strongest performance but they will look to improve going into the next game.

Year 6 Girls Football

Last Friday, the Year 6 girls travelled away to face Gurnard. The girls were positive going into the game that they could secure some crucial league points. As the game begun the girls were second to the ball from the off, leading to Gurnard creating many chances. Just before the half time whistle blew, Gurnard scored to make it 1-0. At halftime we spoke as a team about are positioning and how we need to start trying to string a few passes together to progress up the pitch. The girls took the comments onboard and went into the second half positively. Even though the girls started to show slight signs of improvement, they lost the game 5-0. This was a difficult game for the team however they will come back stronger.

Out and About

This half term the children in **Year 2** have been sharing the story *The Dot* by Peter Reynolds. The **2KG** Out and About group visited St Helens beach on Tuesday morning and were challenged to work together to create their own 'Dot' artwork on the beach using stones, shells and natural found objects. The children looked at some images of Jon Foreman's land art to inspire them and thought carefully about which items to select for their own creation.



On Tuesday afternoon the **3AH** Out and About team visited Niton recreation ground and play park. The children in **Year 3** have been learning about Forces in Science and were set the task of identifying forces in motion when using the play equipment. The children spoke confidently about whether a push or pull force was happening and explained that a force could make an object move, stop, speed up, slow down or change direction. The children all enjoyed exploring the playground together!



The final **Year 4** Out and About group visited The Needles Sweet Manufactory on Wednesday morning to tie into their topic on *Charlie and the Chocolate Factory*. The children were mesmerised watching the demonstration on how sweets are made using traditional methods and machinery. This week's group saw pineapple and mango sweets being made and were able to take some home to taste. After they'd learnt all about the process of making sweets, the group walked down to Alum Bay to see the unusual colourful cliffs and the Needles Lighthouse.



What Parents & Carers Need to Know about

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

With more than two billion active users exchanging texts, photos, videos and documents, as well as making voice and video calls, WhatsApp is the world's most popular messaging service. Its end-to-end encryption only allows messages to be viewed by the sender and any recipients: not even WhatsApp itself can read them. This privacy issue has been in the spotlight recently, as the UK's Online Safety Bill proposes to end such encryption on private messaging; WhatsApp is unwilling to do so and has reportedly considered withdrawing its service in the UK should this legislation go ahead.

EVOLVING SCAMS

WhatsApp's popularity makes it a lucrative hunting ground for scammers. Recent examples include posing as the target's child, requesting a money transfer because of a spurious 'emergency'. Plus a scam where fraudsters trigger a verification message by attempting to log in to your account, then (posing as WhatsApp) call or text to ask you to repeat the code back to them, giving them access.

CONTACT FROM STRANGERS

To start a chat, someone only needs the mobile number of the WhatsApp user that they want to message. If your child has ever given their number out to someone they don't know, that person could then contact them via WhatsApp. It's also possible that your child might be added to a group chat (by one of their friends, for example) containing other people that they don't know.

FAKE NEWS

WhatsApp's connectivity and ease of use allows news to be shared rapidly - whether it's true or not. To combat the spread of misinformation, messages forwarded more than five times on the app now display a "Forwarded many times" label and a double arrow icon. This makes users aware that the message they've just received is far from an original... and might not be entirely factual, either.

'VIEW ONCE' CONTENT

The facility to send images or messages that can only be viewed once has led to some WhatsApp users sharing inappropriate images or abusive texts, knowing that the recipient can't re-open them later to use as evidence of misconduct. People used to be able to screenshot this 'disappearing' content - but a recently added WhatsApp feature now blocks this, citing increased privacy.

CHAT LOCK

Another new option allows users to store certain messages or chats in a separate 'locked chats' folder, saved behind a passcode, fingerprint or face ID authentication. The risk here is that this function creates the potential for young people to hide conversations and content that they suspect their parents wouldn't approve of (such as age-inappropriate material).

VISIBLE LOCATION

WhatsApp's 'live location' feature lets users share their current whereabouts, which can be helpful for friends meeting up or parents checking that their child's safely on the way home, for example. However, anyone in your child's contacts list or in a mutual group chat can also track their location - potentially letting strangers identify a child's home address or journeys that they make regularly.

Advice for Parents & Carers ...TYPING...

EMPHASISE CAUTION

Encourage your child to treat unexpected messages with caution: get them to consider, for example, whether the message sounds like something a friend or relative would really send them. Make sure they know never to share personal details over WhatsApp, and to be wary of clicking on any links in messages. Setting up two-step verification adds a further layer of protection to their WhatsApp account.



THINKING BEFORE SHARING

Help your child to understand why it's important to stop and think before posting or forwarding something on WhatsApp. It's easy - and all too common - for content to then be shared more widely (even publicly on social media). Encourage your child to consider how an ill-judged message might damage their reputation or upset a friend who sent something to them in confidence.

ADJUST THE SETTINGS

It's wise to change your child's WhatsApp settings (go to 'Privacy', then 'Groups') to specify which of their contacts can add them to group chats without needing approval; you can give permission to 'My Contacts' or 'My Contacts Except...'. Additionally, if your child needs to use 'live location', emphasise that they should enable this function for only as long as they need - and then turn it off.



CHAT ABOUT PRIVACY

Some parents like to check in with their child about how they're using WhatsApp, explaining that it will help to keep them safe. If you spot a 'locked chats' folder, you might want to talk about the sort of chats that are in there, who they're with and why your child wants to keep them hidden. Also, if your child has sent any 'view once' content, you could discuss their reasons for using this feature.


