Thank you for continuing to use the one way into and out of school. This will continue for the foreseeable future. On Monday the double green gates will **NOT** be open, instead the smaller gate leading into the school ground by the new playground will be open. Please do not queue up the path leading to Seashells, please do not arrive too early and queue along Beatrice Avenue either.

When you have dropped off your children please leave the site using **the new footpath down to Beatrice Avenue**, please do not exit via the Car Park - this was a temporary arrangement whilst the old building was being demolished.

Please can I remind you that cycling and scooting on site is not allowed (by children or adults!). When you have accessed through the gates please walk your bike or scooter and use the scooter and bike racks supplied to store them. There are racks on both sides of the building.

We will soon be taking ownership of our new playground, which we are very excited about. There is seeding and landscaping going on which will be looked after by a contractor of Sir Robert McAlpine's for the next year. It is already looking good but we can't wait for it all to be complete. The building still continues to be a wonderful space that the children enjoy learning and playing in. We are so pleased with the outcome and would like to thank Sir Robert McAlpine and all of their contractors for an amazing job. We have only used the building 'normally' for 3 weeks before the initial lockdown, so are looking forward to the day when we can fully function in our new building and grounds. Lets hope this isn't too far away!
