Out & About

On Tuesday afternoon our **Year 5** Out and About group tested their map reading skills with a walk at Culver Down. The children used compasses and OS maps to navigate a route from Culver down to Whitecliff Bay. They looked at their maps, spotting key symbols, paths, roads and landmarks when working out their location and plotting their route. The children worked well as team to decide which paths to take. It was great to hear the children using cardinal and ordinal compass directions when explaining which way they needed to go and sensibly navigating their way down to the bay and then back up to the minibus.



The children in **Year 4** have been learning about Queen Victoria and how her residency at Osborne impacted the Isle of Wight. On Wednesday, the Out and About group met Ken Wheeler to learn more about some of the important and unusual visitors that travelled across the world to visit Queen Victoria at Osborne, making it a very important and well known destination within the British Empire. Ken designed, researched and organised Queen Victoria's Town Trail that opened in 2019 to celebrate the 200th anniversary of the births of Queen Victoria and Prince Albert. The children enjoyed discovering the plaques in the pavement as they took part in the trail, starting outside Osborne and finishing in East Cowes town centre. Ken explained more about the lives of each of the 22 people (and animals) that visited the Queen in East Cowes.
