#### **Out and About**

On Tuesday morning all of **RSD** went on a special trip to Monkey Haven. The children have been learning about different animals and will be finding out more about mini-beasts over the coming weeks. It was a rather wet morning, so they all enjoyed using umbrellas as they walked around the Haven, seeing all the monkeys and gibbons. The children took part in a 'Mini-beast experience' with one of the keepers. They had the opportunity to stroke or hold a Giant African Millipede, Jungle Nymph, Sun Beetle and a cockroach! The children learnt all about invertebrates and how the millipede sheds her exoskeleton, growing four extra legs each time.

"I like seeing the monkeys swinging. It was raining and the monkeys were standing out in the rain - I liked walking around in the rain under my umbrella. I held the Giant African Millipede - it was really tickly on my hand and I thought it was going to crawl up my arm. I put my hand on the window and one of the monkeys tried to give me a high five." "We went to the Monkey Haven. I held the giant millipede - it thought the flowers on my coat were real and it tried climbing on to my coat. I liked seeing the monkeys, the ones inside were poking their heads to see us. I liked seeing the meerkats too." Remi-Rose RSD







The children in Year 1 have been learning about animals too this half term. The Out and About team from 1CE visited Nettlecombe Farm in Whitwell on Wednesday. The children had a very muddy time and loved meeting (and hand feeding) all the animals. It was super to see their confidence develop throughout the morning. The children asked the farmer questions and learnt about the animals beaks or teeth, feet or hooves and other attributes.

"We went to the farm and we fed some animals. We saw goats, chickens, sheep and alpacas. I liked feeding the donkey best. I fed it a carrot. You had to hold it right on the end so it doesn't bite your fingers. I enjoyed going to the farm." Imogen 1CE

"We fed some chickens. You had to put the chicken food on your hand, and they pecked it. We fed some donkeys, sheep and a goat. The sheep and goats only have teeth on the bottom so they lick the food off you hand. We fed the donkeys some carrots- you have to be careful, so they don't bite your fingers. 
