to find and then used maps and compasses to locate them. They had a go at working out the bearings on their compasses and what degrees our direction of travel would be. The children were great at hunting for the orienteering posts and even got to have a quick go on the rope swing before we had to head back to school.

They designed postcards,

safe distance from the edge, they loved watching the waves crash and getting a bit splashed! Some of the children were delighted to find painted pebbles on our walk too.

Year 3 are learning about the Stone Age. On Wednesday morning the Out and About group visited



Mottistone and walked up to the Longstone, a 6000 year old (Mesolithic) burial ground. We talked about Pre-history, the different time periods within the Stone Age and how people

would have lived. The children used chalk and charcoal to sketch the two ancient stones and surrounding view. The stones would have once both stood upright and were the



entrance to the long barrow. We were pleased to welcome Mrs Clarke, one of our school Governors, to join our walk and experience an Out and About session.

This half term the children in **Year 2** will be learning about the history of aviation. On Wednesday afternoon, the Year 2 Out and About group visited Bembridge airport. We looked at the planes and talked about the key features of an aeroplane and an airport. The



children then went for a walk, past Bembridge Windmill and down the fields towards the runway. They loved climbing over the stiles, through the kissing gates and getting very muddy! We were all excited to watch the planes takeoff and fly over Culver Down towards Sandown.


