The Year 6 Out and About group had a super afternoon in the sun at Puckpool Battery on Tuesday afternoon. We recapped how to use a compass and the children then created challenges for each other to complete. They demonstrated a great understanding of the cardinal and inter-cardinal directions when following the other teams instructions as well as planning a trail around the Old Battery to the park for a play!



Year 2 Out & About

Out and About children from Year 2 visited Newtown to explore the variety of habitats and wildlife that live there. They were able to locate where Newtown was on their maps and followed a trail around the harbour to the bird hide. The children were welcomed into the bird hide by Jim, a local volunteer, who taught the children how to identify different birds including Shelducks, Egrets and Mediterranean Gulls. They were all very well-mannered and keen to have a go using binoculars to see what they could spot.

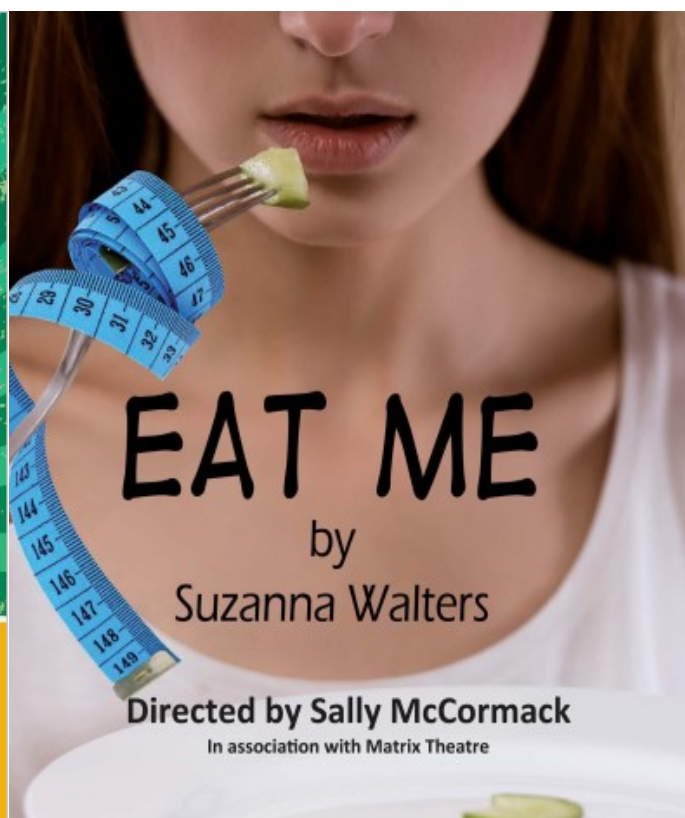

2020 Education Support Fund (ESF)

The ESF is open to publicly funded schools, Academies and Free Schools in the UK attended by Service children, where schools have to mitigate the effects on those Service children whose parents are subject to frequent mobility/deployment.

In light of the ongoing drawdown from Germany and to provide time for the educational authorities across the UK to bring in longer-term provision for Service children as necessary, the Secretary of State for Defence extended the ESF in July 2019 for an additional two years. The fund consisted of £3 million in 2019/20 and the 2020 ESF bidding round has £2 million to award.

The 2020 ESF bidding round opens on Monday 3 June 2020 and closes at 12.00pm on Monday 30 September 2020. Applications from England, Scotland and Wales should be forwarded to DCYP-MOD-ESF-Mailbox@mod.gov.uk. Applications from Northern Ireland should be forwarded to DCYP-MOD-ESF-Mailbox@mod.gov.uk.

Applications can be accepted from publicly funded schools, Academies, Free Schools, 6th Form colleges or from Local Authorities on behalf of publicly funded schools in their area. Result letters will be circulated in January 2021 with payments made to successful applicants in March/April 2021.

Since 2011, the ESF has distributed some £30 million. The CDM awarded from the 2019 ESF supported around 25,000 Service children from all three Services.

Service parents are encouraged to raise awareness of the ESF at their child's school.

Privilege Seat Application Window – Academic Year 2019/20

Dear Parent/Guardian

The dates for the privilege seat application window for academic year 2019 have been finalised. Should you wish to apply for a privilege seat for your child to use the school bus service you will need to apply between 9am on Monday 3rd June 2019 and 4pm on Friday 14th June 2019 for children in school years 0 – 11, only. Please note that the online form will only be live between the above times and that applications received outside of this window will not be accepted.

If you scroll to the bottom of the above webpage you will see the bus services for which you can apply. This information will be live from 9am on Monday 3rd June 2019. Should the service you require not be listed you will not be able to apply for that service at this time.

Do bear in mind that making an application for a privilege seat does not guarantee a seat on the school bus.

Privilege seat ticket prices are set costs as follows.

- Up to a full term £130.00
- Up to half a term £65.00
- Up to a full term AM or PM only £65.00
- Up to half a term AM or PM only £32.50
