


# **Recent trips**

### **Out and About**

On Tuesday morning our **Reception** Out and About group visited the Donkey Sanctuary in Wroxall. The children enjoyed a tour led by one of the lovely volunteers, Debbie. She taught the children lots about what donkeys need, how they are cared for at the sanctuary and why they live there. The children were all extremely well behaved and listened carefully, learning lots of new facts about donkeys and ponies. The team at the Donkey Sanctuary were keen to pass on their thanks to all of the Reception families for their kind donations this term, which will go to fund food and veterinary care for the 117 donkeys they look after.

Eco Tip!

Save fuel when driving by:

- Not slamming on the brakes; avoid speeding up and slowing down too quickly
- Regulate your speed
- Check your boot for weight; are you carrying around needless items that add to the weight increasing your fuel consumption
- Avoid idling! It uses more fuel after 10 seconds than if you had switched your vehicle off and then on again


Just to give you an update - Brooke has raised £355 and had 15" of hair cut off. Both the money raised and the hair have been donated to The Little Princess Trust.
