Welcome to the Summer Term!

Primary School

Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome Back

I can't believe it is the summer term already. This year is speeding by. We have many dates for your diaries, which you will find on the back page of this newsletter. I hope you all had a break over Easter and enjoyed the sunshine. Just a reminder that next Monday 2nd May it is also a bank holiday, so no school until Tuesday 3rd May.

Attendance

It is really important that the children attend school every day. There are, on average, five lessons a day and children can get behind very quickly. Each lesson is carefully planned and builds on the previous lesson's learning. Our current attendance is 93.5% which is very low. To put this in context we would have averaged 96% attendance prior to Covid. We need to work hard together to ensure that we get back to these levels. Please remember to call the office on the morning of the absence and follow this up in writing.

We do not authorise family holidays in term time and these will be subject to a fine of £60 per adult.

Year 4 Residential

Our Year 4 children are off to Kingswood for their residential school trip from Monday 9th May until Wednesday 11th May.





Out & About

The children in **Reception** are learning about transport this half term. The Out and About group from Mrs Barnett's class started their topic with a ride on the train from Ryde Esplande to Brading (and back). They were all very excited and especially loved going under bridges, through the tunnel and changing platforms! The children listened to the story *Green Light for the Little Red Train* by Benedict Blathwayt at the station. They looked out for different types of transport in Ryde, watching the hovercraft depart and the buses come in and out of the bus station too.







On Tuesday afternoon the **6LR** Out and About team went geocaching near Merstone old railway line. They used the geocaching app on their phones to navigate to different caches near the cycle track and nearby farmland. They worked well as a team using the 'hints' provided to hunt for the caches, finding seven in total.







Year 5 have begun their new topic, *Space*. The **5PG** Out and About group went to Bonchurch on Wednesday morning. The children followed the Solar System trail along the seafront to Ventnor, learning about the different planets as they walked. The children also explored the comparable size of the planets, scaled down using a range of different sports balls. When they got back to Bonchurch Green they used the balls to act out how the planets orbit the sun and how the sun's gravitational pull means the closest planets orbit quicker.







Next half term the children in **Year 4** will be exploring how Queen Victoria influenced the popularity of the Isle of Wight. The Out and About team learnt about another popular Victorian, poet Alfred Lord Tennyson, as they hiked up to the Tennyson Monument on Wednesday afternoon. The children demonstrated great resilience and were very proud of themselves for their determination to make it up to the top of the downs. Well done!


Then try this....

We'd love to know what you are reading at home. If you have any reading recommendations, please let us know so we can share them here.




Tesco Community Grant for Queensgate Sensory Garden

Anti-Bullying Ambassador Assemblies

You may recall our anti-bullying ambassadors had some on-line training before the holiday. They suggested to me that they run the Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 assemblies this week. They did a fabulous job reminding the school about the bullying definition:

"Where someone is mean or unkind to someone else in a planned way and over time."

A further definition is:

"Bullying is when you keep picking on someone because you think you're cooler, smarter, stronger or better than them."

The anti-bullying ambassadors taught us about VIP - verbal bullying, indirect bullying and physical bullying. We all agree that they did a great job.

Exams and Tests

We are coming to the time of year of formal assessments. Year 1 will be doing their phonics screen. Year 2 will be doing their SATs in English and maths and some children will be re-doing their phonics screen. Year 4 children will be doing their government multiplication test. Remember they need to know their times tables and division facts to 12 times 12 very quickly.

We have found this to be of benefit to the children in previous years as they not only get a good breakfast but get to spend time with their friends which has really helped with any anxiety they may be feeling.


